

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$31,979,730 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, for the operations of the Executive Branch, Legislative Branch, Judicial Branch, Public Auditor, agencies of the National Government, and for special programs, grants, subsidies, contributions, and refunds of the National Government during fiscal year 1999; to establish a budget for Compact sections 214(b), 215(a)(2), 216(a)(2), 216(a)(3), and 221(b) and to appropriate special funds available therefor under the Compact; to establish a development budget and to appropriate funds available therefor under the Compact; and for other purposes.

- (2) The Speaker or his designee may reprogram up to 10 percent to and from the funds appropriated to each of the subsections in section 2, and may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines within the subsections of section 2.
- (3) The Chief Justice or his designee may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines in section 3.
- (4) The Public Auditor may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines in section 4.
- (5) Allottees of funds may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines within the subsections of section 5.
- (6) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (1) through (5) of this section, no funds may be reprogrammed to or from any personnel account (except as necessary in conjunction with a position transfer permitted under section 14(2) of this act), and no funds may be reprogrammed from section 1(3)(e)(iii) and 1(3)(e)(v) of this act.
- Section 16. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date.
- 25 (1) All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted,

managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance with applicable law, 1 including, but not limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979; PROVIDED, 2 however, that the funds appropriated to Chuuk State under subsection (3) of 3 section 10 of this act shall be retained in the General Fund of the Federated 4 States of Micronesia until a scholarship recipient is identified to the President 5 or the President's designee, at which time scholarship funds in the amount of 6 the scholarship award shall be disbursed directly to the educational institution 7 in the form of a two-party check payable to both the scholarship recipient and 8 the educational institution he or she is attending; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that 9 the allottee of the funds appropriated under section 6(1), (2), and (3) of this 10 act shall be, respectively, the President of the Federated States of Micronesia, 11 the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia, and the 12 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia; and 13 PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under section 14 7 of this act shall be the Secretary of the Department of Transportation, 15 Communication and Infrastructure; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottees 16 for the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(o) of section 11 of this act 17 18 shall be the Governors of the respective States, and no funds appropriated 19 under subsection (2)(o) of section 11 of this act shall be disbursed from the 20 General Fund to the allottees unless the President certifies that the State involved has entered into a joint law enforcement agreement for the period of 21 October 1, 1998, to September 30, 1999, with the National Government 22 pursuant to chapter 12 of title 12 of the Code of the Federated States of 23 Micronesia; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottees of the funds 24 appropriated under subsection 2(hh) of section 11 of this act shall be the 25

Rural Development Community Development Managers of the respective 1 2 States. Funds appropriated under subsection 2(hh) of section 11 of this act 3 shall not be disbursed to a State's Rural Development Community Manager if he fails to submit to the Speaker of Congress and to the President detailed, 4 quarterly financial statements regarding his office's operations, or if he fails to 5 comply with the Financial Management Act of 1979; and PROVIDED FURTHER, 6 7 that the allottees for the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(s) of 8 section 11 of this act shall be the Chief Justices of the respective States; and 9 PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under 10 subsection (1) of section 13 shall be the Personnel Officer of the Division of 11 Personnel Administration. Each allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for the 12 purpose specified in this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of 13 14 the sum appropriated. 15 (2) Allotments shall not exceed the following percentages of the 16 funds appropriated under sections 5(3), 5(6), 7, 9(1), and 13(5) of this act: (a) thirty percent of the appropriation before January 1, 17 18 1999; 19 (b) fifty percent of the appropriation before April 1, 20 1999; 21 (c) eighty percent of the appropriation before July 1, 22 1999. (3) The authority of the allottees to obligate funds appropriated 23 by this act shall lapse as of September 30, 1999; PROVIDED, however, that 24

the authority of the allottees to obligate funds appropriated by sections 3(3),
