

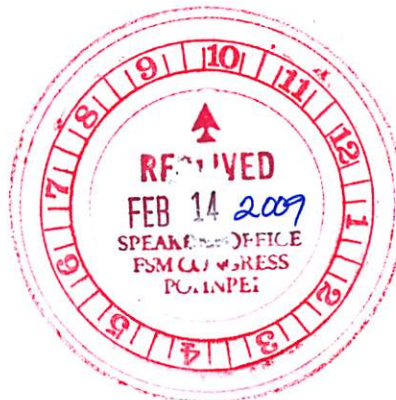

PUBLIC LAW No. 15-72

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 15-32, as amended, by amending Section 1 thereof, to change the use of certain funds previously appropriated therein for the States of Chuuk and Yap, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 15-32, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57 and 15-63, is hereby further
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. The sum of \$3,780,000, or so much thereof
5 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the
6 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year
7 ending September 30, 2008 for the purpose of funding
8 public projects and social programs in each State of the
9 Federated States of Micronesia. The fund shall be
10 apportioned on the basis of \$250,000 or less per member
11 of Congress as follows, PROVIDED THAT an increase of
12 \$300,000 is for Yap State.
