
In my veto message to Congress, I raised the need for public hearing, transparent process in formulating public projects and social programs, and eligibility criteria for such projects and programs. These are essential considerations that Congress should address prior to appropriating funds for public projects and social programs to serve as guide for the Executive branch in implementing the appropriation. The amendments in this Act do not fully address the deficiencies as pointed out here.

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Therefore, I continue to remind Congress that implementation of subsequent public projects may be delayed if they fail to have enough specificity, fail to state the purpose, violate the Udot case, or otherwise continue to ignore the deficiencies in the Act as explained above. Therefore I affirm returning without signature.

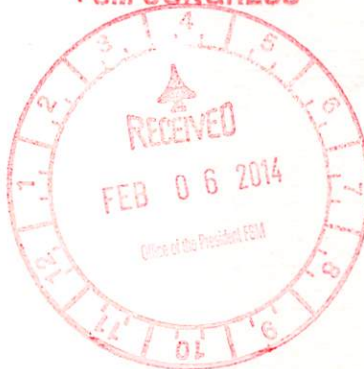



7 amended to read as follows:

8 "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
9 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
10 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
11 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not
12 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The
13 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these
14 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used
15 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that
16 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum
17 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated
18 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap
19 State provided that the allottee of funds appropriated
20 under section 2(e) shall be the President of COM-FSM.
21 The allottee of funds appropriated under sections 3 and
22 4 of this act shall be the President of the Federated
23 States of Micronesia or his designee, EXCEPT THAT the
24 allottee of funds appropriated under subsections (3)(a),
25 (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l),

1 (m), (n), (o), (p), (q), (r), (s), (t), (u), (v), (w),
2 (x), (y) and (aq) of section 3 of this act shall be the
3 Mayor of Lelu Town Government; the allottee of funds

19 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse on
20 September 30, 2015."
