
I reviewed Congressional Act No. 19-13 entitled:

AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 15-32, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57, 15-63, 15-72, 15-78, 16-03, 16-11, 16-33, 16-46, 17-12, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 18-17, 18-67, 18-85 and 18-104, by amending sections 1 and 2 thereof, for the purpose of changing the lapse date of certain funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs in the States of Yap, Kosrae, Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1       Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 15-32, as amended  
2 by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57, 15-63, 15-72, 15-78,  
3 16-03, 16-11, 16-33, 16-46, 17-12, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40,  
4 18-67 and 18-104, is hereby further amended to read as  
5 follows:

6               "Section 1. The sum of \$3,780,000, or so much thereof,  
7 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the  
8 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year  
9 ending September 30, 2008, for the purpose of funding  
10 public projects and social programs in each State of the  
11 Federated States of Micronesia. The fund shall be  
12 apportioned on the basis of \$250,000 or less per member  
13 of Congress as follows, PROVIDED THAT an increase of  
14 \$300,000 is for Yap State.

11 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 15-32, as amended  
 12 by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-57, 15-63, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40,  
 13 18-17 and 18-85, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

14 "Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and  
 15 lapse date. All funds appropriated by this act shall  
 16 be allotted, managed, administered and accounted for  
 17 in accordance with applicable laws, including, but  
 18 not limited to the Financial Management Acts of each  
 19 of the States, the Financial Management Act of 1979  
 20 and the amended Compact of Free Association between  
 21 the United States Government and the Government of  
 22 the Federated States of Micronesia and its related  
 23 agreements. The allottee shall be responsible for  
 24 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may  
 25 be necessary, are used solely for the purpose

1 specified in this act, and that no obligations are  
2 incurred in excess of the sum appropriated. The  
3 allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection  
4 (4)(a) of section 1 of this act shall be the Governor  
5 of Chuuk State or his designee. The allottee of  
6 funds appropriated under subsection 4(b) shall be the  
7 Mortlock Islands Development Authority (MIDA). The  
8 allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 4(d)  
9 of this act shall be the Southern Namoneas  
10 Development Authority. The allottee of fund

4           Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the


