#### AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of \$1,954,482 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, and 18-116, to change the conditions of certain funds therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
