AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 18-70, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-98, 18-112, 18-122, 19-07, 19-24, 19-41, 19-52, 19-73 and 19-82, by amending sections 2, 5 and 6 thereof, to change the use and lapse date of certain funds previously appropriated therein, for the purpose of funding public projects and social programs for the people of Chuuk State and Yap State, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 2. Section 5 of Public Law No. 18-70, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-98, 18-112, 18-122, 19-07, 19-24, 19-44, 19-52 and 19-73, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 5. Of the sum of \$5,100,000 appropriated by this act, \$2,150,000 is apportioned for public projects and social programs in the state of Chuuk.

9 Section 3. Section 6 of Public Law No. 18-70, as amended by
10 Public Laws Nos. 18-98, 18-112, 18-122 and 19-07 and 19-24, is
11 hereby further amended to read as follows:

12 "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
13 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
14 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
15 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not
16 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The
17 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these
18 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used
19 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that
20 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum
21 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated
22 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap
23 State EXCEPT THAT the funds appropriated under
24 subsection 2(i) shall be the President of COM-FSM. The
25 allottee of funds appropriated under sections 3 and 4 of


1 this act shall be the President of the Federated States
2 of Micronesia or his designee EXCEPT THAT the funds
3 appropriated under subsections a, b, c, d, e, f, g, h,
4 i, j, k, l, m, n, o, s, t, u, v, w, x, ag, ah, aj, ap
5 and aq of section 3 this act shall be the Mayor of Lelu
6 Town Government or his designee; the funds appropriated
7 under subsections a, b, c, d, e, f and g of section
8 4(1), subsections 4(3)(b), (c), (d), (f) and (p) of this
9 act shall be the Pohnpei Transportation Authority, and the
10 funds appropriated under subsection 4(3)(t) shall be the
11 Luhkenmoanlap of Kittu. The allottee of funds
12 appropriated under subsections 5(1), 5(3) and 5(6), of
13 this act shall be the Governor of Chuuk State or his
14 designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under
15 subsection 5(2) of this act shall be the Mortlock
16 Islands Development Authority. The allottee of funds
17 appropriated under subsection 5(4) of this act shall be
18 the Southern Namoneas Development Authority. The
19 allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(5) of
20 this act shall be the Faichuk Development Authority.
21 The authority of the allottee to obligate funds
22 appropriated by this act shall lapse on September 30,
23 2017."

PUBLIC LAW No. 19-101

Section 4. This act shall become law upon approval by the
President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
becoming law without such approval.
