Dear Speaker Simina:

I am pleased to transmit the following Congressional Act, which I have signed into Public Law No.21-144:

Congressional Act No. 21-147, entitled: "AN ACT TO FURTHER AMEND PUBLIC LAW NO. 15-32, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NOS. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57, 15-63, 15-72, 15-78, 16-03, 16-11, 16-33, 16-46, 17-12, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 18-17, 18-67, 18-85, 18-104, 19-17, 19-100, 19-157, 20-34 AND 20-38 BY AMENDING SECTIONS 1 AND 2 THEREOF, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CHANGING THE USE, ALLOTTEE AND LAPSE DATE OF CERTAIN FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED THEREIN TO FUND PUBLIC PROJECTS AND SOCIAL PROGRAMS FOR THE PEOPLE OF CHUUK STATE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

I regret to inform you that I am vetoing the specific line-items as follow:

- Section 1(4)(a)(iii) project titled "Fishing project"
- Section 1(4)(a)(vi) project titled "Leadership exposures and travel needs"

The reason behind this line-item veto is a technical error in the amendments under these two sections. Section 1(4)(a)(vi) project amount is being reduced by \$6,860. This amount is being reappropriated under Section 1(4)(a)(iii). However, Section 1(4)(a)(iii) project is being increased by \$11,000 resulting in the amounts in this new appropriation not adding up.

Additionally, and possibly the root problem behind this, there is a discrepancy between the provisions in the signed version of Public Law No. 20-38 and the unsigned version of Public Law No. 20-38 uploaded on the Congress website. I urge the 21<sup>st</sup> Congress to take necessary action to determine the cause of this discrepancy and have it resolved at its earliest convenience. Thank you.

#### AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 15-32, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57, 15-63, 15-72, 15-78, 16-03, 16-11, 16-33, 16-46, 17-12, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 18-17, 18-67, 18-85, 18-104, 19-17, 19-100, 19-157, 20-34 and 20-38 by amending sections 1 and 2 thereof, for the purpose of changing the use, allottee and lapse date of certain funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs for the people of Chuuk State, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 2 of Public Law No. 15-32, as amended 1 by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-57, 15-63, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 2 18-17, 18-85, 19-17, 19-100, 19-157, 20-106 and 21-34, is 3 hereby further amended to read as follows: "Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and 5 lapse date. All funds appropriated by this act shall 6 be allotted, managed, administered and accounted for 7 in accordance with applicable laws, including, but 8 not limited to the Financial Management Acts of each 9 10 of the States, the Financial Management Act of 1979 11 and the amended Compact of Free Association between the United States Government and the Government of 12 the Federated States of Micronesia and its related 13 14 agreements. The allottee shall be responsible for 15 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for the purpose 16 specified in this act, and that no obligations are 17 incurred in excess of the sum appropriated. 18 The 19 allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection 20 (4)(a) of section 1 of this act shall be the Governor 21 The allottee of of Chuuk State or his designee. funds appropriated under subsection 4(b) shall be the 22 Mortlock Islands Development Authority (MIDA).
