Dear Speaker Simina,

I am pleased to transmit the following act, when I have signed to become Public Law No. 21-147 with line item veto:

Congressional Act No. 21-150, entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9 AND 12 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 21-42, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NOS. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, AND 21-116, TO APPROPRIATE \$130,691 OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2020, AND REALLOCATE FUNDS IN ORDER TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FOR THE OPERATIONS OF THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA, TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FOR STAFF HOUSING, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

I noted that with respect to the funding of \$100,000 for Aid to FSM Students in Japan (line 6, page 18), this amount was partially spent as appropriated based upon records of the Department of Finance. De-appropriating the entire amount at this stage is invalid. Given that several line items in this supplemental budget were funded as a result of de-funding section 6(8)(g), I would recommend Congress to revisit this supplemental budget and rectify the error by restoring the original appropriation under section 6(8)(g) at the earliest opportunity. Thank you.

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AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, and 21-116, to appropriate \$130,691 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, and reallocate funds in order to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, to provide supplemental funding for staff housing, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1       Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by  
2 Public Law Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94 and 21-116 is hereby further  
3 amended to read as follows:

4               "Purpose. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the  
5 sum of \$72,309,261 from the General Fund of the  
6 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year  
7 ending September 30, 2020, for the purpose of funding  
8 the operations of all branches of the National  
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its  
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and  
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources  
12 Development. The National Government's share of the  
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT  
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact  
15 Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the  
16 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in

1 the budget for the Department of Education. The sum  
2 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

3 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by  
4 Public Law No. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94 and 21-116 is hereby further  
5 amended to read as follows:

4       Section 7. Section 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by  
5 Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, and 21-116 is hereby further  
6 amended to read as follows:

7               "Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and  
8               Lapse Dates.

9               (1) General provisions.

10               (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
11               allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
12               accordance with applicable law, including, but not  
13               limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

14               (b) The allottees shall be responsible for  
15               ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be  
16               necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in  
17               this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess  
18               of the sums appropriated.

19               (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds  
20               appropriated by this act are as follows:

21               (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall  
22               be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

23               (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds shall  
24               be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States  
25               of Micronesia;

1                   (c) Section 4 – the allottee of these funds shall  
2                   be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the  
3                   Federated States of Micronesia;

4                   (d) Section 5 – the allottee of these funds shall be the  
5                   Public Auditor of the Federated States of Micronesia;

6                   (e) Sections 6 through 9 – the allottee of these  
7                   funds shall be the President of the Federated States of  
8                   Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following  
9                   subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

10                   (i) Sections 8(1)(f) and 8(13)(q) – the  
11                   allottee of these funds shall be the Chair of the Joint  
12                   Committee on Compact Review and Planning;

13                   (ii) Section 8(8)(a) – the allottee of these

14 Micronesia-FSM;

15 (xii) Section 9(3)(b) - the allottee of these  
16 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

17 (xiii) Section 9(3)(c) - the allottee of  
18 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of  
19 Pohnpei;

20 (xiv) Section 9(3)(d) - the allottee of  
21 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

22 (xv) Section 9(3)(e) - the allottee of  
23 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

24 (xvi) Section 9(12)(b) - the allottee of  
25 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the

1 Federated States of Micronesia;

2 (xvii) Section 9(12)(f)– the allottee of

9 (xx) Section 9(12)(d) – the allottee of  
10 these funds shall be the President of the Constitutional  
11 Convention.

12 (xxi) Section 9(12)(g) - the allottee of  
13 these funds shall be the Mayor of Pinglap.

14 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to  
15 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as  
16 of September 30, 2020; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds  
17 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not  
18 lapse.



Section 8. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its  
becoming law without such approval.
