TENTH SPECIAL SESSION, 2021 CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 21-388, C.D.1, C.D.2, C.D.3, C.D.4

### AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 8, 9, and 12 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-210 and 21-221 to appropriate \$2,871,547 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; the Legislative Branch; the Judicial Branch; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by
- 2 Public Laws Nos. 21-210 and 21-221, is hereby further amended to
