CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 2-220, C.D.1

AN ACT

Relating to the adoption of the "Code of the Federated States of Micronesia," and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Statement of intent. This act is intended to effect a
- 2 codification of the general and permanent National laws of the Federated
- 3 States of Micronesia and is not intended to effect any substantive changes
- 4 therein.
- 5 Section 2. Designation of code. The attached manuscript is in-
- 6 corporated by reference herein and is hereby designated as the "Code of
- 7 the Federated States of Micronesia." This code contains the National
- 8 laws of the Federated States of Micronesia and is prepared under the
- 9 authority of the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia, by
- 10 contract between the National Government of the Federated States of
- 11 Micronesia and the Book Publishing Company of Seattle, Washington,
- 12 Section 3. Adoption as positive law.
- 13 (1) All enacted law of the Interim Congress of the Federated
- 14 States of Micronesia, except for Public Law No. IC-28, and all enacted
- 15 law of the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia which are
- 16 incorporated in part II of the attached manuscript are hereby readopted
- 17 and reenacted as positive law of the Federated States of Micronesia in
- 18 the form appearing in the manuscript,
- 19 (2) All enacted law which is readopted and reenacted pursuant
- 20 to subsection (1) of this section is hereby repealed in its prior form,
- 21 Section 4, Other documents not adopted. The inclusion in part
- 22 III of the attached manuscript of the documents relating to the Govern-

- 1 ment of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands is not to be con-
- 2 strued as an adoption of those documents or as recognition of their
- 3 efficacy in the Federated States of Micronesia.
- 4 Section 5. Laws unaffected. Nothing in this act affects the
- 5 validity of either appropriation laws, other temporary National laws
- 6 not included in this code, or laws enacted after October 1, 1981, by the
- 7 Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia.
- 8 Section 6. Rights and liabilities unaffected. The repeal in section
- 9 3 of this act does not affect the status of any civil or criminal actions,
- 10 rights, or liabilities existing before the repeal takes effect.
- 11 Section 7. Government authority unaffected. The republication in
- 12 this code of Trust Territory laws and the retention of references therein
- 13 to the authority of the Government of the Trust Territory of the Pacific
- 14 Islands are not intended to alter, diminish, or in any way change or
- 15 affect the authority of the National Government or the respective State
- 16 governments of the Federated States of Micronesia over the subjects of
- 17 legislation included therein, as that authority has been established by
- 18 the Constitution of the Federated States of Micronesia, the State charters
- 19 or constitutions, and other applicable law.
- 20 Section 8. State law reaffirmed. The authority of the States of
- 21 the Federated States of Micronesia with regard to those provisions of the
- 22 Trust Territory Code within the jurisdiction of the States is unaffected
- 23 and hereby reaffirmed.
- Section 9. Technical amendment of prior law. Technical amendments
- 25 to laws included in part II of this code, whether or not those laws are

1 readopted and reenacted pursuant to section 3 of this act, are hereby enacted regarding the following: 3 (1) Organization and numbering of titles, chapters, sub-4 chapters, sections, and other subparts; 5 (2) Changes in phraseology; (3) Changes in introductory materials; and 7 (4) Correction of errors. 8 Section 10. Future amendments; citations. 9 (1) Future amendments to laws included in part II of this 10 code, whether or not those laws are readopted and reenacted pursuant to section 3 of this act, shall be made with reference to such laws as they 11 12 appear in this code. 13 (2) The preferred citation of laws included in part II of this code is as follows: first, the title number in Arabic numerals; 14 second, "F.S.M.C."; and third, section number. Example: The citation 15 of section 201, "Qualifications of Senators," of title 9, "National Elections, "would appear as "9 F.S.M.C. 201." 17 Section 11. Supplements as part of code. 18 19 (1) The laws contained in any current pocket parts or supplements to this code, printed and published under contract or other-20 wise as may be authorized by law, constitute prima facie a part of 21 this code if the laws, as so contained, purport to represent reproduc-22 23 tions of statutory amendments to this code, as stated in accompanying notes thereto. 24

(2) If pocket parts or supplements are published on a

| 11 | Section 13, Effective date. This act shall become law upon approval |
| 12 | by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its be- |
| 13 | coming law without such approval, |
