A BILL FOR AN ACT

To establish a program to assist the States to prevent, prepare for, and recover from natural and man-made disasters, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Short title. This act is known and may be cited as
- 2 the "Disaster Relief Assistance Act of 1989."
- 3 Section 2. Findings and intent.
- 4 (1) The Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia
- 5 finds and declares that:
- 6 (a) Natural and man-made disasters kill and injure
- 7 people, disrupt communities and the workings of government, destroy
- 8 and damage property, cut off income and cause suffering of other
- 9 kinds; and
- 10 (b) Due to the severe impact of disasters, the
- 11 resources of the States are oftentimes inadequate to cope with them
- 12 so that the States require the assistance of the National Government
- 13 and other sources of available aid to restore devastated areas.
- 14 (2) Therefore the Congress of the Federated States of
- 15 Micronesia intends by this act to:
- 16 (a) Provide for a permanent, orderly program of
- 17 National Government assistance to the States and local governments in
- 18 carrying out their responsibilities to alleviate suffering and damage
- 19 which result from disasters by:
- 20 (i) Revising and broading the scope of existing
- 21 disaster relief programs;
- 22 (ii) Encouraging the development of
- 23 comprehensive disaster preparedness and assistance plans, programs,
- 24 capabilities, and organizations by the States and local governments;
- 25 (iii) Encouraging hazard mitigation measures to

1	reduce lossess from disasters, including development of land use and
2	construction regulations;
3	(iv) Achieving greater coordination and
4	responsiveness of disaster preparedness and relief programs; and
5	(v) Providing National Government assistance
6	for losses sustained as a result of a disaster.
7	(b) Authorize the President to establish a program of
8	disaster preparedness, assistance and relief that utilizes the
9	services of all appropriate agencies, including the assistance from
10	the United States Federal agencies, and other foreign governments and
11	agencies providing assistance during disasters to provide for:
12	(i) Preparation of disaster preparedness plans
13	for mitigation, warning, emergency operations, renabilitation, and
14	recovery;
15	(ii) Training and exercise;
16	(iii) Post-disaster critique and evaluation; and
17	(iv) Coordination of the National, States and
18	local preparedness programs.
19	Section 3. Definitions. As used in this act, the following
20	definitions shall apply:
21	(1) "Disaster" means the imminent threat or the occurrence
22	of widespread injury or death to persons, or severe widespread injury
23	to, or destruction of, property caused by a natural or man-made
24	catastrophe;
25	(2) "Hazardous facility" means any material, equipment, or

- 1 facility, public or private, which threatens loss of life or injury
- 2 to persons or property substantially worse, in the event of a
- 3 disaster, than that expected under normal conditions;
- 4 (3) "Man-made" means any event or activity which may
- 5 cause, or causes, a disaster which is the result of man's actions and
- 6 not through natural occurrences;
- 7 (4) "National Government" means the Government of the
- 8 Federated States of Micronesia;
- 9 (5) "State of emergency" means a formal declaration by the
- 10 President that a disaster is imminent or has occurred, and that the
- 11 States need National and possibly international aid to prevent,
- 12 prepare for, or recover from the disaster; and
- 13 (6) "States" means the governments of the States of the
- 14 Federated States of Micronesia.
- 15 Section 4. <u>Limitations</u>. Except as otherwise provided in this
- 16 act, its language shall not be construed to:
- 17 (1) Interfere with the dissemination of news or comment on
- 18 public affairs; but any communications facility or organization,
- 19 including, but not limited to, radio and television stations, wire
- 20 services, and newspapers, may be required to transmit or print public
- 21 service messages furnishing information or instructions in connection
- 22 with a disaster;
- 23 (2) Affect the jurisdiction or responsibilities of State,
- 24 municipal, or local police forces, and fire fighting forces; or
- 25 (3) Limit, modify, or abridge the authority of the

- 1 President to assist the States in responding to disasters or to
- 2 exercise any other powers vested in him by the laws of the Federated
- 3 States of Micronesia, independent of, or in conjunction with, any
- 4 provisions of this act.
- 5 Section 5. Presidential authority.
- 6 (1) For any of the purposes of this act, the President may
- 7 declare a state of emergency. Within 30 days after the declaration
- 8 of emergency, the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia
- 9 shall convene at the call of its Presiding Officer or the President
- 10 to consider revocation, amendment, or extension of the declaration.
- 11 Unless it expires by its own terms, is revoked or extended, the
- 12 declaration of emergency is effective for 30 days.
- 13 (2) The President shall also have the power to issue
- 14 Presidential orders as needed in a state of emergency.
- 15 (3) Any Presidential order issued under subsection (2) of
- 16 this section shall be disseminated promptly and brought to the
- 17 attention of both the general public and government officials
- 18 responsible for acting during and after any state of emergency.
- 19 (4) During a state of emergency, the President is
- 20 authorized to suspend any regulatory statutes, or any order, rule, or
- 21 regulation of an executive agency of the National Government. The
- 22 President snall exercise this authority only if strict adherence to
- 23 the provisions of the regulatory statute, order, rule, or regulation
- 24 would prevent, ninder, or delay actions needed to prevent, prepare
- 25 for, or recover from a disaster.

(5) The President or his designee shall coordinate 1 2 National Government activities to assist the States to prevent, 3 prepare for, and recover from disasters. (6) The President may request aid from the United States 5 Government and from other foreign public and private entities 6 providing disaster assistance. The President snall coordinate such 7 foreign aid with assistance provided by the National Government. (7) In the event of a threatened or existing disaster, the 9 President may provide immediate assistance from the Disaster Relief 10 Fund, Public Law No. 2-64, to save lives, preserve property, and ll protect public health and safety. The President may provide such 12 assistance by directing National Government agencies to: (a) Give technical assistance and provide advisors to 13 14 affected States; (b) Lend equipment, supplies, facilities, and 15 16 personnel to affected States; and (c) Perform on public or private lands or waters 17 emergency services needed to save lives, preserve property, and 18 19 protect public nealth and safety. Section 6. State responsibilities. 20 (1) To be eligible for National assistance pursuant to 21 22 this act, a State shall: (a) Prepare a disaster plan meeting the standards set 23 24 forth in subsection (2) of section 7 of this act and the implementing 25 regulations required by that section;

- 1 (b) Appoint a State officer to develop and maintain
- 2 the State disaster plan, and recommend to the Governor measures
- 3 appropriate and necessary to prevent, prepare for, and recover from
- 4 disasters; and
- 5 (c) In the event of a threatened or existing
- 6 disaster, regularly broadcast warnings and information concerning any
- 7 disaster. The broadcasts shall be in both the predominant native
- 8 languages of the State and English. The President or his designee
- 9 may study the need for broadcasts in other languages and accommodate
- 10 such need in the regulations required by subsection (2) of section 7
- ll of this act.
- 12 (2) If the Governor of a State determines that the State
- 13 needs National assistance to prevent, prepare for, or recover from
- 14 disasters, he may request such aid from the President. The President
- 15 shall assess the State's need and may render such aid as needed,
- 16 subject to available funds. Any State desiring to obtain disaster
- 17 assistance from a foreign government or organization must submit such
- 18 request to the President for transmission.
- 19 Section 7. National Government responsibilities. The President
- 20 or his designee shall:
- 21 (1) Assist the States in preparing and maintaining their
- 22 disaster plans and review the disaster plan prepared by each State to
- 23 ensure Federated States of Micronesia eligibility for funding under
- 24 the United States Federal Emergency Management Act.
- 25 (2) Promulgate rules and regulations setting forth minimum

- 1 requirements for the State disaster plans, in accordance with the
- 2 requirements of chapter 1 of title 17 of the Code of the Federated
- 3 States of Micronesia. Such rules and regulations shall have the
- 4 force and effect of law. The regulations may include, but are not
- 5 limited to:
- 6 (a) General requirements for preventing injury and
- 7 damage, for speedy action in response to a disaster, and for other
- 8 measures of emergency relief that may be necessary;
- 9 (b) A requirement that particularly vulnerable areas,
- 10 including, but not limited to, outlying islands, be identified and
- 11 accorded special consideration;
- 12 (c) Guidelines for land use regulations and building
- 13 standards that promote safety; and
- (d) Requirements that appropriate measures be taken
- 15 to prevent injury and damage, such as the construction of seawalls
- 16 and emergency snelters.
- 17 (3) Create a National disaster plan incorporating features
- 18 of the State disaster plans. After approval by the President, the
- 19 National plan shall be promulgated by Presidential order.
- 20 (4) Survey industries, facilities, and other public and
- 21 private resources within the Federated States of Micronesia that may
- 22 be useful for carrying out the purposes of this act. The President
- 23 or his designee shall inform the States of the results of the survey
- 24 and, as needed, assist in preparing legislation to ensure
- 25 governmental control of such resources in the event of a threatened

- 1 or existing disaster. The President may, by regulation, authorize
- 2 National assistance to the States in compensating the owners of
- 3 private resources and facilities used or destroyed in the event of a
- 4 threatened or existing disaster, pursuant to and subject to the
- 5 conditions of section 9 of this act.
- 6 (5) Compose and maintain a register of persons in the
- 7 Federated States of Micronesia with training and expertise useful in
- 8 preventing, preparing for, and recovering from disasters. Copies of
- 9 the revised register shall be distributed annually to the States.
- 10 (6) Prepare and distribute to the States a list of foreign
- 11 public and private assistance programs available to them.
- 12 (7) Locate nazardous facilities publicly or privately
- 13 owned, and, as needed, assist the States in drafting provisions of
- 14 State disaster plans applicable to such facilities.
- 15 (8) Determine what means exist for speedy and efficient
- 16 communications in the event of a threatened or existing disaster and
- 17 pursue improvements as necessary to integrate or supplement such
- 18 communications.
- 19 (9) Keep abreast of weather conditions which could
- 20 potentially develop into a natural disaster.
- 21 Section 8. Restoration of National facilities.
- 22 (1) The President may authorize repair, restoration, or
- 23 replacement of any National Government facility. The authorization
- 24 snall be based on a determination that the repair, restoration, or
- 25 replacement is so urgent that it cannot await specific legislation to

1 redress the problem.

- 2 (2) National Government departments and offices shall
- 3 assess the natural and man-made hazards that threaten their
- 4 facilities and shall take appropriate action to reduce or eliminate
- 5 such hazards.
- 6 Section 9. Compensation for property used or destroyed by order
- 7 of a State Governor.
- 8 (1) The National Government shall provide no aid to the
- 9 States to compensate persons who volunteer their services to prevent,
- 10 prepare for, or recover from disasters.
- 11 (2) If State resources are inadequate to compensate the
- 12 owners of private land, facilities, and other resources which the
- 13 Governor of the State orders used or destroyed to prepare for,
- 14 prevent the spread of, or recover from a disaster, National
- 15 assistance may be provided from the Disaster Relief Fund, Public Law
- 16 No. 2-64, at the discretion of the President. The Governor of the
- 17 affected State may submit such claims for compensation, calculated
- 18 according to fair market value, to the President for approval.
- 19 (3) The President, in reviewing a State Governor's
- 20 requests for compensation pursuant to this section, shall ensure that
- 21 no claimant receives compensation for any part of a claim for which
- 22 the claimant has received financial aid from other sources, including
- 23 insurance. Partial compensation for the claimant's loss, received
- 24 prior to the State Governor's request, shall not preclude National
- 25 aid for the remainder.

1	(4) If the President finds that National aid has
2	duplicated any part of aid otherwise received by a claimant, he shall
3	direct such claimant to pay to the Treasurer of the Federated States
4	of Micronesia the amount of such superfluous aid for deposit to the
5	Disaster Relief Fund, Public Law No. 2-64.
6	(5) The President is authorized to promulgate rules and
7	regulations to implement the purposes of this section, in accordance
8	with the requirements of chapter 1 of title 17 of the Code of the
9	Federated States of Micronesia. Such rules and regulations shall
10	have the force and effect of law.
11	Section 10. No cause of action created. Nothing in this act
12	snall be construed to create or authorize any cause of action against
13	the National Government, its officials or employees for failure to
14	prevent or mitigate the effects of a disaster.
15	Section 11. Effective date. This act shall become law upon
16	approval by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or
17	upon its becoming law without such approval.
