## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend title 55 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 5-16, 5-88, 5-119, 5-121, 5-136, and 6-22, by amending sections 1001 and 1002 to change the composition of the commission and the selection of a chairman, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1001 of title 55 of the Code of the Federated 2 States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 "Section 1001. Commission created. There is hereby 4 created a Kosrae State Commission on Improvement Projects. 5 The commission shall be composed of the following: the thit wagistrate mayor from each of the municipalities of 7 Lelu, Tafunsak, Malem, and Utwal the Kostae State Ditector 8 of public worked and the Kostae State ditector of tesoutees 9 and developments and one appointed each from the Kostae 10 Delegation to the constess of the redetated states of nictot nesia and from the speaker of the state legislature, and two 11 appointees by the Governor subject to confirmation by the 12 13 legislature." 14 Section 2. Section 1002 of title 55 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: 15 16 "Section 1002.
