A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 8-18 by amending sections 1, 3, 5, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 17 to appropriate the sum of \$3,044,814 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, as supplemental funding for the executive branch, judicial branch, agencies of the National Government, post-secondary educational assistance, other National Government programs, grants, subsidies, contributions and refunds and the National Development Budget; to specify the apportionment of funds for the College of Micronesia-FSM, post-secondary education assistance and Compact section 221(b) programs; to authorize one more position in the National Postal Service; to remove the lapse date on funds for the Continental Airlines Scholarship; and for other purposes.
