

AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 8-18 by amending sections 1, 3, 5, 11, and 13 to appropriate the sum of \$5,624,196 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, as supplemental funding for the executive branch, the National judiciary, agencies, other National Government programs, grants, subsidies, contributions and refunds and the development budget; to amend section 14 to raise the employment ceiling; to amend section 15 with respect to overtime; to amend section 16(1) with respect to reprogramming; to amend section 17 with respect to the allottee; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 8-18 is hereby amended

2 to read as follows:

3 "Section 1. Operating expenses of the executive branch. The  
4 sum of \$12,623,992, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is  
5 hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States  
6 of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994,  
7 for the operations of the executive branch of the National  
8 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia during fiscal  
9 year 1994. Of the total funds appropriated under this section  
10 \$546,389 shall be deemed to come from the funds available under  
11 section 216(a)(1) of the Compact of Free Association. The sum

13 "Section 16. Reprogramming.

14 (1) The President may reprogram up to 10 percent to and  
15 from the funds appropriated to each department and office in  
16 section 1. The President or his designee may reprogram up to  
17 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated to any division,  
18 and may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from each line within  
19 the budget of a division, within a department or office or its  
20 functional equivalent.

21 (2) The Speaker or his designee may reprogram up to 10  
22 percent to and from the funds appropriated to each of the  
23 subsections in section 2, and may reprogram up to 15 percent  
24 to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines within  
25 the subsections of section 2.

1                   (3) The Chief Justice or his designee may reprogram up  
2                   to 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated in each of  
3                   the lines in section 3.

4                   (4) The Public Auditor may reprogram up to 15 percent  
5                   to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines in  
6                   section 4.

7                   (5) Allottees of funds may reprogram up to 15 percent  
8                   to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines  
9                   within the subsections of section 5.

10                  (6) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (1)  
11                  through (5) of this section, no funds may be reprogrammed  
12                  to or from any personnel account (except as necessary in  
13                  conjunction with a position transfer permitted under section  
14                  14(2) of this act) or subparagraph (a)(iii) of subsection  
15                  (12) of section 1 of this act."

16                  Section 9. Section 17 of Public Law No. 8-18 is hereby amended to  
17                  read as follows:

18                  "Section 17. Allotment and managbement of funds and lapse  
19                  date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted,  
20                  managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance with  
21                  applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Financial  
22                  Management Act of 1979, as amended; PROVIDED, however, that  
23                  the allottees for the funds appropriated under subparagraphs

8 10 of this act shall be the President of the Federated States  
9 of Micronesia. The allottee of the funds appropriated under  
10 subsection (2)(s)(iii) of section 11 of this act shall be the  
11 Chief Justice of Chuuk State. The allottee of the funds  
12 appropriated under subparagraph (q)(iii) of subsection (2) of  
13 section 11 of this act shall be the Chief of Police of Chuuk  
14 State. Each allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that  
15 these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used  
16 solely for the purposes specified in this act, and that no  
17 obligations are incurred in excess of the sum appropriated;  
18 PROVIDED FURTHER, that the President shall be the allottee  
19 of the funds appropriated under subparagraph (q)(v) of  
20 section 11 of this act and shall not reallocate the funds to the  
21 States except in accordance with the Congressional intent as  
22 expressed in Standing Committee Report No. 8-8, C.D.1. The  
23 authority of the allottees to obligate funds appropriated by  
24 this act shall lapse as of September 30, 1994; PROVIDED,  
25 however, that the authority of the allottees to obligate funds

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
