AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 8-75, ^{which} to appropriate the sum of \$10,100,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, to fund public projects in the four States, by amending section 2 to change the use of funds previously appropriated therein, by amending section 3 to change and specify the allottees of funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 2 of ~~Congressional Act No. 8-56~~ ^{Public Law No. 8-75} is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. The funds appropriated under section 1 of this act shall be apportioned as follows:
