A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend section 404 (formerly section 403) of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 6-11, for the purpose of requiring that foreign fishing boats install and use vessel monitoring systems, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 404 (formerly section 403) of title 24
- 2 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by

- "Section 404. <u>Foreign fishing agreements Terms</u>. All foreign fishing agreements shall have the following minimum terms:
 - (1) The foreign party and the owner or operator of any fishing vessel shall acknowledge the exclusive fishery management authority of the Federated States of Micronesia within the exclusive economic zone;
 - (2) The foreign party or the owner or operator of any fishing vessel fishing, as appropriate, pursuant to such agreement shall:
 - (a) comply with the requirements of this title, all regulations issued pursuant to this title and all other applicable laws and regulations;
 - (b) permit any officer authorized to enforce the provisions of this title to board and search or inspect any vessel at any time and make arrests and seizures provided for in section 508 of this title whenever such officer has reasonable cause to believe, as a result of such a search or inspections, that any such vessel or any person has committed an act prohibited by this title;

5	(d) allow and assist any authorized officer to

8	(e) immediately comply with every instruction
9	given by an authorized officer, facilitate safe
10	boarding, and facilitate the inspection of the vessel,
11	gear, equipment, records, fish and fish products;
12	(f) allow and assist authorized observers to
13	board the vessel for scientific, monitoring, compliance
14	and other functions, and have full access to, and the
15	use of, facilities and equipment on board the vessel
16	which the authorized observer may determine is necessary
17	to carry out his duties; have full access to the bridge,
18	fish on board and areas which may be used to hold,
19	process, weigh and store fish; remove samples; have full
20	access to the vessel's records, including its logs and
21	documentation for the purpose of inspection and copying;
22	and gather any other information relating to fisheries
23	in the exclusive economic zone;
24	(g) not assault, obstruct, resist, delay,
25	refuse boarding to, intimidate, or interfere with an

2	performance of his duties;
3	(h) display any permit or permit number issued
4	for any such vessel pursuant to sections 109 through 111
5	of this title or any documentation required to be
6	displayed under foreign fishing agreements in the
7	wheelhouse of such vessel;
8	(i) ensure that appropriate position-fixing
9	and identification equipment shall be installed and
10	maintained in working order on each such vessel;
11	(j) ensure that the vessel is marked in

24	fishing, in the event allocations are established in

2	continuously operate on each vessel, all at no expense
3	to the Federated States Micronesia, such vessel
4	monitering systems or components thereof as may be
5	directed by the Attorney General of the Federated States
6	of Micronesia.
7	(3) Foreign parties will:
8	(a) apply, pursuant to section 109 of this
9	title, for any required permits;
10	(b) deliver promptly to the owner or operator
11	of the appropriate fishing vessel any permit which is
12	issued under that section for such vessel; and
13	(c) abide by the requirement that no foreign
14	fishing will be permitted in the exclusive economic zone
15	without a valid and applicable permit, except as
16	provided by foreign fishing agreements concluded
17	pursuant to this chapter, and that all conditions and
18	restrictions of the permit, or any applicable foreign
19	fishing agreement, are complied with."
20	Section 2. This act shall become law upon approval by the
21	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
22	becoming law without such approval.
