Dear Speaker Simina:

I am pleased to transmit the following Act, which I have signed into Public Law No. 20-83 with item veto:

Congressional Act No. 20-85: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 AND 12 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 20-42, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NOS. 20-54, 20-64 AND 20-67, IN ORDER TO APPROPRIATE \$1,445,693 OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2018, TO DEAPPROPRIATE \$20,000 OF FUNDS FROM A PARTICULAR LINE ITEM, TO CLARIFY THE INTENDED USE OF FUNDS FOR A PARTICULAR LINE ITEM, TO DESIGNATE CERTAIN ALLOTTEES FOR MULTIPLE LINE ITEMS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

I want to thank you and the members of Congress for taking care of the supplemental budget. While I noted a lot of cuts, I am sure you have our government's good health at heart. We will request your favorable consideration of additional needed funding in the upcoming July session.

I am saddened to inform you of my decision to item veto the money provided to Yap for search and rescue fuel and for medical referral. The matters for which the money is earmarked is good. As a matter of fact I think it is just too small, even for just the State of Yap. In this current fiscal year I believe we have expended for search and rescue and medical evacuations upwards of \$200,000. Also, all the states would require such a fund.

Without going into too much reasoning, let me just say that in line-vetoing this item, I recommend that Congress in its next session revisit the issue, appropriate \$200,000, and make the Department of Justice the allottee of the funds without specifying how the exercise is to be carried out.

Further, I urge Congress to rectify the Department of R&D's budget, which was mistakenly reduced by more than \$600,000 on page 3 line 19. I must veto this error in order to preserve R&D's budget for its operation.

In closing, I thank the 20th Congress for expeditious passage of the supplemental budget.

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-54, 20-64 and 20-67, in order to appropriate \$1,445,693 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to deappropriate \$20,000 of funds from a particular line item, to clarify the intended use of funds for a particular line item, to designate certain allotees for multiple line items, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by

2 Public Law No. 20-54, is hereby further amended to read as

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the sum of \$83,554,726 from the General Fund 5 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal 6 year ending September 30, 2018, for the purpose of 7 funding the operations of all branches of the National 8 9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its 10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and 11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources 12 Development. The National Government's share of the 13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain 10 percent of 14 the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected 15 16 in the budget for the Department of Education. The sum appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:" 17
