A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 9-154, by amending section 5, and to further amend title 55 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, by amending section 505, for the purpose of paying amounts owed by the States for trust funds created by early retirement legislation, provided that an equal amount of funds are used by the States for certain Health and Educational needs, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1	Section	on 1. Section 5 of Public Law No. 9-154 is hereby
2	amended to	read as follows:
3		"Section 5. Relending Conditions.
4		(1) Relending of proceeds to a State shall be by
5		way of a Financing Agreement between the National
6		Government and the State which:
7		(a) requires the establishment of a separate
8		trust account within the national investment portfolio,
9		for the benefit of the State but under the control of
10		the Secretary of Finance, into which the State (or the
11		National Government, if a State meets the criteria set
12		forth in subsection (1)(b) of this section) must
13		gradually deposit, by September 30, 2001, and
14		thereafter maintain, a sum not less than the principal
15		balance which it owes;
16		(b) requires the National Government to pay
17		into a State's trust account amounts owed by the State
18		in accordance with subsection (1)(a) of this section,
19		provided that:
20		(i) the State creates a separate Health
21		and Education Fund and deposits into that Fund an
22		amount equal to the amount that it owes for its
23		subsection (1)(a) trust account;
24		(c) requires the State to use the money in
25		that Health and Education Fund solely for health and

educational needs that do not involve: 1 2 (a) salaries or benefits for state 3 employees whose positions were created after the effective date of Public Law No. 9-154; 4 5 (b) purchasing or maintaining vehicles, 6 other than school buses or ambulances; 7 (c) travel outside of the Federated 8 States of Micronesia; 9 (d) requires a State to pay to the National 10 Government any amount of money that was deposited into the State's Health and Education Fund, created in 11 12 accordance with subsections (1)(b) and (1)(c) of this 13 section, if the Public Auditor determines that the 14 amount was used by a State for a purpose prohibited by 15 subsection (1)(c) of this section; (be) grants to the National Government an 16 17 unconditional security interest in the State's share of section 211 block grants and section 217 inflation 18 adjustments under the Compact of Free Association and 19 in the State's share of national tax revenues; 20 (∉f) binds the State to the set-off provisions of 21 section 3 of Public Law No. 9-136; 22 (dg) contains such other provisions as the 23 24 President or the Bank may require; and

7	Section 2. Section 505 of title 55 of the Code of the
8	Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as
9	follows:
10	"Section 505. <u>Duties</u> .
11	The duties of the Public Auditor shall be as
12	follows:
13	(1) The Public Auditor shall inspect and
14	audit transactions, accounts, books, and other
15	financial records of every branch, department,
16	office, agency, board, commission, bureau, and
17	statutory authority of the National Government and
18	of other public legal entities, including, but not
19	limited to, States, subdivisions thereof, and
20	nonprofit organizations receiving public funds
21	from the National Government.
22	(2) The Public Auditor shall inspect and
23	audit transactions, accounts, books, and other
24	financial records associated with any project,
25	program, and activity receiving funding in whole

or in part from public funds of the National Government . including a State's Health and Education Fund, created in accordance with subsection (1)(b) and (1)(c) of Public Law No.9-154. The Public Auditor shall perform audits as otherwise specifically required by statute. (4) The Public Auditor shall have the discretion to perform audits, or assist in the performance of audits, upon request by the States. (5) The Public Auditor shall have the exclusive audit jurisdiction over public funds of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, but he shall have the authority to contract for independent auditing services to be performed under his supervision in instances where specialized expertise is required, or where auditing requirements are beyond the capacity of the Public Auditor's staff and separate funding is available. (6) The Public Auditor shall file a report at least once a year with the Congress. Public Auditor may file other reports at such

other times as he may determine. All reports of

public. 1 The Public Auditor may submit 2 (7)recommendations with his audit reports which shall 3 be confined to matters within the jurisdiction of the Public Auditor, including compliance or noncompliance with laws governing the expenditure of public moneys, and the need for amendments or new laws to secure the efficient expenditure of 8 public funds. 9 (8) The Public Auditor shall keep a complete and 10 accurate record or file of all audit reports, 11 inspections, investigations, releases, audit work 12 13 papers, and other materials pertaining to the work of the Office of the Public Auditor." 14 Section 3.
