## TWELFTH CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

TO further amend title 53 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, by amending sections 606, 703, 801, 802, 803 and 806, and by enacting new sections 801A and 801B, to reduce administrative costs, simplify the calculation of benefits, and make technical corrections to the Federated States of Micronesia Social Security Act, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1	Section 1. Section 606 of title 53 of the Code of the Federated
2	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	"Section 606. <u>Accounts, budget, and costs of administration</u> .
4	(1) At such time as the Social Security Board may
5	prescribe, the Social Security Administrator shall submit to
6	the Board, on forms and in the manner prescribed by the
7	Board, a detailed estimate of the budget for the next ensuing
8	fiscal year for the proper conduct of the Social Security
9	System. [ <del>The</del> ] <u>At a minimum, the</u> Social Security
10	Administrator shall submit to the Board:
11	(a) the audited accounts of the income and expenditure
12	and the balance in the Social Security Retirement Fund for
13	the last completed fiscal year;
14	(b) a statement showing the estimated income and
15	expenditure for the fiscal year in progress, together with
16	such summaries, schedules, and supporting data as may be
17	deemed necessary;

1	(c) a statement showing the estimated balance of the
2	Social Security Retirement Fund at the close of the fiscal
3	year in progress; and
4	(d) a budget showing the estimated income and
5	expenditure for the next ensuing fiscal year.
6	(2) For the next ensuing fiscal year, the estimated costs
7	of administration, including salaries and wages, purchase of
8	office supplies, operational expenses, and the maintenance of
9	branch offices, shall not exceed an expenditure maximum equal
10	to [ <del>11</del> ] <u>10</u> percent of the [ <del>estimated</del> ] <u>net</u> income for [ <del>that</del> ]
11	the last completed fiscal year [from contributions and
12	interest and dividend income on investments less investment
13	expenses]. The audited accounts from the last completed
14	fiscal year and the budget for the ensuing fiscal year shall
15	be approved by the Board and submitted to the President and
16	the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia. Should
17	the estimated costs of administration exceed the expenditure
18	maximum, legislative approval of the budgeted administration
19	expenses is required."
20	Section 2. Section 703 of title 53 of the Code of the Federated
21	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
22	"Section 703. <u>Promulgation of regulations - Hearings -</u>
23	<u>Employees - Annual report</u> .
24	(1) Regulations. Within 90 days of this act becoming law,
25	the [ <del>The</del> ] Board [ <del>may</del> ] <u>shall</u> adopt, <u>and may thereafter</u>

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1 amend $[\tau]$  or rescind, regulations for the administration of this subtitle. All such regulations shall be promulgated for 2 3 public comment and shall be adopted, amended, or rescinded pursuant to the provisions of chapter 1 of title 17 of [this] 4 5 the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia. [It may] 6 (2) Hearings. The Board shall hold hearings, or make 7 decisions upon hearings delegated to others, for the purpose 8 of determining any question involving any right, benefit, or obligation of any person subject to this subtitle. [It may] 9 (3) Employees. The Board shall fix the compensation of 10 11 such employees it deems necessary within the limits of available administrative funds budgeted for its operation, 12 13 and [it] may contract for special actuarial and other counseling on a fee basis. It shall bond itself and its 14 15 employees in such amounts as it shall fix. [It] (4) Accounts. The Board shall receive audited accounts of 16 the Social Security System [within 90 days of the end of the 17 fiscal year of the system] and transmit these accounts to the 18 President and the Congress of the Federated States of 19 20 Micronesia within 90 days of the end of the fiscal year of 21 the system. The annual accounts and reports shall be made 22 available to the public. [It] Each fiscal year, the Board shall also submit to the President and the Congress [for each 23 24 fiscal year] a report on its operations and the condition of 25 its funds, and [subject to section 707 of this chapter, in

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1	<del>such report</del> ] shall <u>therein, pursuant to section 707 of this</u>
2	chapter, make recommendations for amendments to this subtitle
3	as it deems desirable."
4	Section 3. Section 801 of title 53 of the Code of the Federated
5	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
б	"Section 801. <u>Scope of coverage; Verification of employment</u> .
7	(1) All employees, wherever employed by an employer
8	incorporated or doing business in the Federated States of
9	Micronesia, shall be covered by the provisions of this
10	subtitle, unless both the employer and the employee are
11	currently subject to any other recognized Social Security
12	System.
13	(2) The highest administrator of the Social Security
14	System, or his designees, shall cause at least two
15	unannounced employment site checks to be conducted upon every
16	non-government employee who first begins to contribute to the
17	Social Security System after age 45 years to ensure that such
18	non-government employee is actually engaged in an employer-
19	employee relationship that will allow him to be covered and
20	eligible for benefits under this subtitle. The two
21	employment site checks shall not be conducted within one
22	month from each other and both shall be conducted within the
23	first six months of the employee's first contribution payment
24	to the Social Security System.

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(3) For the purposes of this subtitle, any elected official

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1	in any Government unit or body in the Federated States of
2	Micronesia is deemed to be an employee employed by a
3	Federated States of Micronesia employer. The governmental
4	unit or body to which such person is elected is subject to
5	the provisions in this subtitle relating to the duty and
6	obligations of a Federated States of Micronesia employer.
7	[ <del>(2) Every person who:</del>
8	(a) is a fully insured individual, as defined in this
9	subtitle;
10	(b) has attained age 60 years; and
11	(c) has filed application for old age insurance shall
12	be entitled to an old age insurance benefit for each month,
13	beginning with the month for which both paragraphs (a) and
14	(b) of this subsection are satisfied and ending with the
15	month preceding the month in which he dies, subject to the
16	earnings test as defined in this subtitle.]"
17	Section 3. Title 53 of the Code of the Federated States of
18	Micronesia, as amended, is hereby further amended by enacting a new
19	section 801A to read as follows:
20	"Section 801A. Old age benefits.
21	(1) Eligibility. Every person who:
22	(a) is a fully insured individual, as defined in this
23	subtitle;
24	(b) has attained 60 years of age; and
25	(c) has filed an application for old age insurance

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1	<u>benefits;</u>
2	shall be entitled to an old age insurance benefit.
3	(2) Duration of benefits. Benefits shall be paid on a
4	monthly basis and shall begin as of the date such person
5	attains the age of sixty years and end with the date such
6	person dies; provided, however, that such benefits shall be
7	subject to the earnings test as defined in this subtitle and
8	shall be prorated for any portion of a month during which
9	such person is ineligible to receive benefits."
10	Section 4. Title 53 of the Code of the Federated States of
11	Micronesia, as amended, is hereby further amended by enacting a new
12	section 801B to read as follows:
13	"Section 801B. Disability benefits.
14	(1) Eligibility. Every individual who:
15	(a) is a fully insured individual;
16	(b) is disabled and has been disabled for at least
17	three full calendar months; and
18	(c) has filed an application for disability insurance
19	benefits; shall be entitled to a disability insurance
20	benefit. A person becomes 'disabled' as of the date he is
21	medically determined to be under a disability.
22	(2) Duration of benefits. Disability insurance benefits
23	shall be paid on a monthly basis and shall be paid as of the
24	date the person is determined to be under a disability and
25	end with the date on which such person dies or recovers from

1	<u>t</u>	the disability; provided, however, that such benefit shall be
2	<u>8</u>	subject to the earnings test as defined in this subtitle and
3	<u>8</u>	shall be prorated for any portion of a month during which
4	<u>8</u>	such person is ineligible to receive benefits."
5	Sectio	on 6. Section 802 of title 53 of the Code of the Federated
6	States of M	Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
7	11	'Section 802. <u>Surviving spouse's benefits</u> .
8	I	The surviving spouse of an individual who died fully insured,
9	i	if such spouse has filed <u>an</u> application <u>for survivor's</u>
10	<u>k</u>	penefits, shall be entitled to a monthly survivor insurance
11	k	penefit [ <del>for each month</del> ], beginning with the [ <del>month</del> ] <u>date</u> of
12	Ċ	leath of the fully insured spouse and ending with the [month
13	Ē	preceding the month in] date on which the surviving spouse
14	Ċ	lies or remarries; provided, <u>however,</u> that such benefit shall
15	k	be subject to the earnings test as defined in this subtitle
16	ā	and shall be prorated for any portion of a month during which
17	5	such spouse is ineligible to receive such benefit."
18	Sectio	on 7. Section 803 of title 53 of the Code of the Federated
19	States of M	Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
20		'Section 803. <u>Dependent's benefits [- Disability benefits]</u> .
21		(1) Every surviving child who is dependent upon an
22	i	individual entitled to old age <u>or disability</u> benefits or who
23	И	was dependent upon an individual who died fully insured or
24	С	currently insured, shall be entitled, upon filing
25	a	application, to a <u>monthly</u> child's insurance benefit <u>,</u> [ <del>for</del>

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1	<del>each month</del> ] beginning with the [ <del>month</del> ] <u>date</u> of death of such
2	individual and ending with the [month preceding whichever]
3	date on which any of the following first occurs:
4	(a) attainment of <u>the</u> age <u>of eighteen</u> [ <del>18</del> ] years,
5	except that;
6	<u>(i) such</u> benefits [ <del>are</del> ] <u>shall be</u> payable until
7	the [month before the attainment of] age <u>twenty-two</u> [ <del>22</del> ] so
8	long as the beneficiary is a bona fide student[ $-$ ]; and
9	[except_that]
10	<u>(ii) such</u> benefits [ <del>are</del> ] <u>shall be</u> payable during
11	the disability of a child who was disabled before [ <del>the</del>
12	attainment of] attaining the age of twenty-two [22];
13	(b) marriage; or
14	(c) adoption <u>;</u>
15	provided, however, that such benefit shall be paid on a
16	monthly basis and shall be prorated for any portion of a
17	month during which said child is ineligible to receive a
18	<u>child's insurance benefit</u> .
19	(2) A child shall be deemed dependent upon his parent or
20	adopting parent unless such individual was not living in the
21	same household with or contributing to the support of such
22	child. Child's insurance benefits shall be paid to the
23	individual upon whom the child is currently dependent, except
24	such benefit shall be subject to the earnings test as defined
25	in this subtitle.

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1	[ <del>(3) Every individual who is a fully insured individual and</del>
2	is disabled and has been disabled for at least three full
3	calendar months, upon filing an application for disability
4	insurance benefits, shall be entitled to a disability
5	insurance benefit for each month beginning with the first
6	month of the waiting period and ending with the month
7	preceding the month in which he dies or recovers from his
8	disability, subject to the earnings test as defined in this
9	subtitle.]"
10	Section 8. Section 806 of title 53 of the Code of the Federated
11	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
12	"Section 806. <u>Amount of survivor insurance benefits</u> .
13	(1) The surviving spouse of a fully insured worker eligible
14	in accordance with section 802 of this chapter shall be paid
15	a monthly benefit or disability in an amount equal to [ <del>sixty</del> ]
16	<u>65</u> percent of the <u>total monthly</u> retirement or disability
17	insurance benefit [ <del>calculated for</del> ] <u>previously paid to</u> the
18	deceased spouse [at the date of death].
19	(2) Each eligible child of an insured worker shall be
20	entitled to a monthly benefit of [fifteen] 20 percent of the
21	total monthly retirement or disability insurance benefit
22	[ <del>calculated for</del> ] <u>previously paid to</u> the deceased parent [ <del>at</del>
23	the date of death].
24	(3) If the spouse of the deceased insured worker is
25	eligible for retirement or disability benefits based on his

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1 or her own employment coverage, and is also eligible for 2 survivors' benefits, the spouse shall receive [whatever] 3 whichever benefit pays the largest monthly payment, but not 4 both.

5 (4) The total amount of survivors' benefit paid to the spouse and children may not exceed the [retirement benefit 6 7 calculated for the decedent as of the date of death] total monthly benefit previously paid to the decedent, except that 8 if the surviving spouse receives benefits based on his or her 9 own employment coverage, that amount plus the survivors' 10 11 benefits for the children may exceed the total amount of the deceased's [retirement] benefit. In no event shall the 12 amount paid be less than the minimum amount set forth 13 14 [established by the Social Security Administration, as set 15 out] in section 804 of this chapter [title 53 of the code of the Federated States of Micronesia]." 16

17 Section 9. This act shall become law upon approval by the 18 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming 19 law without such approval.
