A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate \$80,672 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, to re-appropriate the funds which lapsed on September 30, 2001, under Public Law No. 11-36, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1	Section 1. The sum of \$80,672, or so much thereof as may be				
2	necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the				
3	Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30,				
4	2002, to re-appropriate the funds which lapsed on September 30, 2001,				
5	under Public Law No. 11-36. The funds appropriated under this section				
6	shall be apportioned as follows:

13	Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date.				
14	(1) All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted,				
15	managed, administered and accounted for in accordance with applicable				
16	law, including, but not limited to, the Financial Management Act of				
17	1979. The allottee of the funds appropriated by this act shall be the				
18	President of the Federated States of Micronesia, or his designee. The

1	allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much
2	thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for the purpose specified
3	in this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum
4	appropriated.
5	(2) The authority of the allottee to obligate funds appropriated
6	by this act shall lapse as of September 30, 2002.
7	Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the
8	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming
