A RESOLUTION

To accede to the Convention for the Suppression of the Traffic in Persons and of the Exploitation of the Prostitution of Others, and for other purposes.

- 1 WHEREAS, prior to 1937, four international instruments were
- 2 in force relating to the suppression of the traffic in women and
- 3 children;
- WHEREAS, in 1937, the League of Nations prepared a draft
- 5 Convention extending the scope of the four referenced instruments;
- 6 WHEREAS, since 1937, developments have made possible the
- 7 consolidation of the referenced instruments and embodying the
- 8 substance of the 1937 draft Convention;
- 9 WHEREAS, the United Nations General Assembly approved the
- 10 Convention for the Suppression of the Traffic in Persons and of
- 11 the Exploitation of the Prostitution of Others (hereinafter
- 12 "Convention") by passing resolution 317(IV) on December 2, 1949;
- 13 WHEREAS, the Convention entered into force on July 25, 1951,
- 14 and is entered in the United Nations Treaty Series at volume 96,
- 15 page 271;
- 16 WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Convention states that the
- 17 Convention shall be open to any member of the United Nations to
- 18 ratify or accede to the Convention;
- 19 WHEREAS, the President of the Federated States of Micronesia
- 20 signed the Convention in New York on September 23, 2003; now,
- 21 therefore,
