A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 15-55, by amending its title, sections 1, 5, 7, 8, 9 and 12 thereof, in order to appropriate an additional amount of \$69,648,310 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009, appropriate \$33,321,789 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2009, and for other purposes.
