A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend section 403 of chapter 4 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, and section 603 of chapter 6 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, to mandate that authorized observers must be present on all fishing boats at all times, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 403 of chapter 4 of title 24 of the Code
- 2 of the Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law
- 3 No. 12-34, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 4 "Section 404. Access agreements minimum terms. All
- 5 access agreements shall include the following minimum
- 6 terms:
- 7 (1) the foreign party recognizes the sovereign rights
- 8 and exclusive fishery management authority of the
- 9 Federated States of Micronesia within the exclusive
- 10 economic zone;
- 11 (2) the operator and each member of the crew shall
- 12 comply with the applicable access agreement, applicable
- permit conditions, this subtitle, all regulations issued
- 14 pursuant to this subtitle and all other applicable laws
- and regulations;
- 16 (3) the operator shall:
- 17 (a) <u>not operate any vessel with a valid and</u>
- 18 <u>applicable permit without</u> [accept] at least one of the
- 19 Authority's authorized observers on board at all times,

1	unless granted permission by the Authority in the case
2	of emergency circumstances;
3	(b) provide any authorized observer, while on
4	board the vessel, at no expense, with officer level
5	accommodations, food and medical facilities;
6	(c) meet the following costs of the authorized
7	observer:
8	(i) full travel costs to and from the
9	vessel;
10	(ii) salary; and
11	(iii) full insurance coverage;
12	(d) display any permit or permit number issued
13	for any such vessel, pursuant to this subtitle, or any
14	other documentation as required by the Authority to be
15	displayed, under any access agreement, in the wheelhouse
16	of such vessel;
17	(e) ensure that appropriate position-fixing and
18	identification equipment is installed and maintained in
19	working order on each vessel;
20	(f) ensure that the vessel is marked and
21	identified in accordance with the Food and Agricultural
22	Organization (FAO) approved Standard Specifications for
23	the Marking and Identification of Fishing Vessels;
24	(g) ensure the continuous monitoring of the
25	international distress and call frequency 2182 kHz (HF)

or the international safety and call frequency 156.8 MHz
(channel 16, VHF-FM) to facilitate communication with
the fisheries management, surveillance and enforcement
authorities;

- (h) ensure that a recent and up-to-date copy of the International Code of Signals (INTERCO) is on board and accessible at all times;
- (i) ensure that the vessel is seaworthy and contains adequate life safety equipment and survival gear for each passenger and member of the crew;
- (j) ensure that, promptly upon direction by the Authority, each vessel will have installed, maintained and fully operational at all times on board a transponder, in accordance with section 611 of chapter 6 of this subtitle, and shall be responsible for all operational and maintenance costs of the transponder and cooperate fully with the Authority in their utilization.
- (4) the party to the access agreement shall, for the duration of the access agreement:
- (a) appoint and maintain a resident agent in the Federated States of Micronesia that is approved by the Authority, or establish and maintain a company registered in accordance with the laws of the Federated States of Micronesia, authorized to receive and respond to any legal process issued in the Federated States of

1 Micronesia with respect to the owner or operator of the 2 vessel, and shall notify the Federated States of 3 Micronesia of the name and address of such agent or 4 company, and any communication, information, document, 5 direction, request or response to, or from that agent or 6 company, shall be deemed to have been sent to, or 7 received from such owner or operator; 8 (b) not exceed any allocation which may be 9 established in any given licensing period in accordance 10 with this subtitle; (c) ensure compliance by each fishing vessel, its 11 operator and crew members, with the access agreement, 12 all laws of the Federated States of Micronesia and the 13 14 terms of the permit; and (d) ensure compliance by each fishing vessel, its 15 16 operator and crew members, with subregional and regional 17 conservation and management measures for highly 18 migratory fish stocks." 19 Section 2. Section 607 of chapter 6 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as enacted by Public Law 20 No. 12-34, is hereby further amended to read as follows: 21 22 "Section 607. Access granted to authorized observers; 23 conditions; expenses. 24 (1) Any person on board any vessel with a valid and 25 applicable permit shall allow any authorized observer to

1 board and remain on such vessel at all times for the 2 purposes of carrying out his duties and functions. 3 (2) The operator and each member of the crew of such 4 vessel shall allow and assist any authorized observer 5 to: 6 (a) board such vessel for scientific, compliance 7 monitoring and other functions, at such time and place as the Executive Director may require; 8 9 (b) have full access to and the use of facilities 10 and equipment on board the vessel which the authorized 11 observer may determine is necessary to carry out his duties, including: 12 13 (i) full access to the bridge, navigation 14 charts, fish on board and areas which may be used to 15 hold, process, weigh and store fish; 16 (ii) full access to the vessel's records, 17 including its logbooks and documentation for the 18 purposes of records inspection and copying; 19 (iii) full access to fishing gear on board; 20 and 21 (iv) reasonable access to navigation 22 equipment and radios; (c) take and remove from the vessel reasonable 23 24 samples for the purposes of scientific investigation, 25 and other relevant information;

1 (d) take photographs of the fishing operations, 2 including fish, fishing gear, equipment, charts and 3 records, and remove from the vessel such photographs or 4 film as he or she may have taken or used on board the 5 vessel; (e) send or receive messages by means of the 6 7 vessel's communications equipment; 8 (f) carry out all duties safely; and 9 (q) disembark at such time and place as the 10 Executive Director may reasonably request or as required in accordance with an applicable access arrangement. 11 12 (3) The operator shall provide the authorized 13 observer[, and any authorized officer forced by 14 circumstances to stay on board the vessel for a prolonged period of time,] while on board the vessel 15 16 with food, accommodation and medical facilities at no 17 expense, equivalent to that accorded to officers. 18 (4) In addition to the requirements of subsection (3) 19 of this section, the Authority shall, either by 20 regulation or agreement, require the operator to pay in 21 full the following costs of authorized observers, other 22 than port samplers: (a) travel costs to and from the vessel; 23

1	(c) full insurance coverage.
2	(5) The Authority may, by regulation or agreement,
3	require the operator to pay a portion of the costs of
4	maintaining a port sampling program.
5	(6) Any operator of any vessel with a valid permit
6	issued under this subtitle, shall allow and assist any
7	authorized observer to have full access to any place
8	where fish taken in the fishery waters is unloaded or
9	transshipped; to remove reasonable samples for
10	scientific purposes and to gather any information
11	relating to fisheries in the fishery waters.
12	(7) Any person who commits an act, or omits to act, in
13	violation of this section shall be subject to a civil
14	penalty of not less than \$40,000 and not more than
15	\$100,000."
16	Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the
17	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
18	becoming law without such approval.
