A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 15-30 by amending Sections 1 and 2 thereof, to change the use and allottee of certain funds previously appropriated for public projects and social programs for the States of Chuuk and Kosrae, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 15-30 is hereby 1 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "Section 1. The sum of \$3,780,000, or so much thereof 4 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the 5 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2008 for the purpose of funding 6 7 public projects and social programs in each State of the Federated States of Micronesia. 15	Federated States of Micronesia for Chuuk
16	Election District No. 5 established pursuant
17	to Public Law No. 13-83.
18	Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date.
19	All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted, managed,
20	administered and accounted for in accordance with applicable laws,
21	including, but not limited to the Financial Management Acts of
22	each of the State, the Financial Management Act of 1979 and the
23	amended Compact of Free Association between the United States
24	Government and the Government of the Federated States of
25	Micronesia and its related agreements. The allottee shall be

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1 responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as
   may be necessary, are used solely for the purpose specified in
 3 this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the
 4 sum appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated under
 5 subsections (4)(a), (d), (e) and (f) of section 1 of this act
   shall be the Chuuk State Commission on Improvement Project. The
 7 allottee of funds appropriated under subsections 1, 3, 4(b) and
 8 4(c) of section 1 of this act shall be the President of the
 9 Federated States of Micronesia or his designee. The allottee of
10 funds appropriated under subsection (2) of section 1 of this act
   shall be the Governor of the State of Yap. The funds appropriated
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   by this act shall remain available until fully expended.
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        Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the
   President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
   becoming law without such approval.
