## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 102, 401, 403 and 404 of title 9 of the code of the Federated States of Micronesia in order to modify the definition of "resident" qualified to participate in the national elections to avoid disenfranchising qualified FSM citizens outside of the Federated States of Micronesia, to strengthen the requirements in keeping of records, and to clarify the procedures of registration of voters and distribution of Voter Identification Card, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 102 of title 9 of the code of the
- 2 Federated States of Micronesia, is hereby amended to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 "Section 102.Definitions.
- 5 The following terms shall have the following meanings:
- 6 (1) 'Citizen' means a citizen as defined by the
- 7 Constitution of the Federated States of Micronesia and
- 8 title 7 of the Code of the Federated States of
- 9 Micronesia;
- 10 (2) 'Congress' means the Congress of the Federated
- 11 States of Micronesia;
- 12 (3) 'Congressional Election District' means the
  13 district apportioned by population for which a two-year
- term Member is elected;
- 15 (4) 'Election Day' means the date in the Federated
- States of Micronesia on which National Elections are
- 17 conducted in the Federated States of Micronesia without

regard to the actual date at any Polling Place outside 1 2 the Federated States of Micronesia; 3 (5) 'Member' means a two-year or four-year member of 4 the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia; 5 (6) 'Municipality' means a subdivision of a 6 Congressional Election District; 7 (7) 'National Election' means any general or special election for a Member, or any national referendum on a 9 constitutional amendment; (8) 'National Election Director' means the person 10 11 appointed in accordance with subsection 302(1) of this 12 title; 13 (9) 'National Election Office' means the office or 14 other locations designated by the National Election 15 Director as a location from where official national election activities are carried out; 16 17 (10) 'National Voter Register' means the list of all Registered Voters in the Federated States of Micronesia 18 19 who registered to vote with a National 20 Election Office; 21 (11) 'Polling Place' means a location officially 2.2 designated by the National Election Director where 23 voters cast their ballots in a National Election, 24 including special polling places, VAAPP polling places, 25 mobile polling places and traveler polling places;

1 (12) 'Polls' may refer to two or more Polling Places, 2 or all Polling Places generally; 3 (13) 'President' means the President of the Federated 4 States of Micronesia; 5 (14) 'Public Property' means any land, buildings, facilities, vessels, vehicles, equipment, supplies or 6 7 other resources that are owned, operated or controlled by the National Government, a State government or a 8 9 municipal government, or any subdivision, agency or 10 department thereof; 11 (15) 'Public Employee' means any employee of the 12 National Government, a State government or a municipal 13 government, or any subdivision, agency or department 14 thereof; 15 (16) 'Registered Voter' means a person who has 16 registered to vote pursuant to chapter 4 of this title. (17) 'Resident', for purposes of this act, means a 17 <u>Citizen whose domicile is a State of the Federated States</u> 18 19 of Micronesia.[a person] A domiciliary of a State is a 20 Citizenwhoisphysically present[qualifies as a resident 21 under the laws of the in a State in which the person has 22 registered, or seeks to register, to vote[+]. Where a

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Citizen is not physically present, his or her domicile

is that State where he or she intends to return after

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1	being absent there-from for reasons of business,
2	occupation, employment, education or recreation.
3	(18) 'Signature List' means the certified list of
4	Registered Voters in a Municipality or Congressional
5	Election District that any person seeking to vote on
6	Election Day must sign at their designated Polling Place
7	before being issued a ballot;
8	(19) 'State' means one of the four States of the
9	Federated States of Micronesia;
10	(20) 'State Election Office' means the official office
11	or other locations designated by the national election
12	<pre>commissioner [State election officials or state</pre>
13	government] as a location from where official state
14	election activities are carried
15	out;
16	(21) 'State Voter Register' means the list ofRegistered
17	Voters for a Congressional ElectionDistrict or
18	Municipality who registered to votewith a State Election
19	Office;
20	(22) 'VAAPP' means voting at another polling place in
21	accordance with section 604 of this title; and
22	(23) 'Voter Identification Card' means an
23	identification card issued under the authority of the
24	National Election Director to a Registered Voter that
25	contains the Registered Voter's name, registration

number, State, Congressional Election District, 1 2 Municipality, date of birth, sex, signature and other 3 identifying information, and that provides a means of 4 indicating whether that Registered Voter has already 5 cast a ballot in each National Election." Section 2. Section 401 of title 9 of the code of the 6 Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: 9 "Section 401. National Voter Register. (1) There shall be one unified National Voter Register 10 11 for all of the Federated States of Micronesia, which 12 shall consist of the full name, date of birth, sex, 13 State, Congressional Election District and Municipality 14 of residence, registration number and other 15 identifyinginformation that the National Election 16 Director deemsappropriate, of all Registered Voters who 17 are currentlyeligible to vote. (2) A Registered Voter shall only have one entry on 18 the National Voter Register. 19 20 (3) The National Election Director shall be 21 responsible for creating, maintaining and preserving the

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commissioners shall provide accurate

National Voter Register with the assistance of the

national election commissioners. The national election

informationconcerning the registered voters in their

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respective states to ensure that citizens of the
Federated States of Micronesia who are qualified to vote
are not deprived of their constitutional right of
suffrage.

- (4) The National Voter Register shall be used to generate the Signature Lists for the various Polling Places.
  - (5) Reconciling State Voter Register

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- (a) On a periodic basis, the National Election
  Director shall reconcile the National Voter Register
  with the State Voter Register thereby ensuring that all
  Registered Voters on the State Voter Registers are also
  listed on the National Voter Register.
- (b) Thirty days before a National Election, the National Election Director shall perform a final reconciliation of the State and National Voter Registers before the Signature Lists are generated from the National Voter Register.
- (c) When reconciling the State Voter Register with the National Voter Register, the National Election Director shall ensure that a Registered Voter has only one entry on the National Voter Register pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.

1 (6) The National Voter Register shall be open to
2 public inspection at all times during normal business
3 hours."

Section 3. Section 403 of title 9 of the code of the Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as 6 follows:

"Section 403. <u>Eligibility to register; place of registration and voting</u>.

- (1) Every Citizen who fulfills the requirements enumerated in section 103 of this title may register to vote in the National Elections in the State,

  Congressional Election District and Municipality in which he or she <u>is a Resident</u> [currently resides].
- (2) Except as provided in sections 404 and 406 of this chapter, a person shall register to vote at a National Election Office or State Election Office in the State in which the person is a Resident. The national electioncommissioners, with the approval of the National Election Director, may designate other locations within a State where a person may register to vote or may conduct mobile registration drives.
- (3) No person shall register to vote in National Elections in any State, Congressional Election District or Municipality other than the one in which he or she <u>is a Resident[currently resides]</u>.

(4) Once a person has registered to vote in National
Elections in a State and Congressional Election

District, he or she shall not vote in a National
Election for another State or Congressional Election

5 District without first filing a change of registration

6 request form and receiving written notice of approval of

7 that request pursuant to section 405 of this chapter.

- (5) Except as provided in chapter 6 of this title, no person shall vote in National Elections in any State, Congressional Election District or Municipality other than the one in which he or she [currently resides] is a Resident; provided, however, that where there is a mistake in placing the name of a voter on the Signature List of a Polling Place in a State, Congressional Election District or Municipality in which he or she does not reside, such voter shall nevertheless be allowed to vote therein, if otherwise qualified. The election board member of theparticular Polling Place where such voter has voted shall notify the national election commissioner of the affected State of the error in order that such voter shall be placed on the correct Signature List for the next National Election.
- (6) A Citizen must be a Resident of only [If a person is a Resident of more than] one Statewhere he or she is registered to vote. If he or she [, or]physically resides

1 in more than one Congressional Election District, he or she [may]mustchoose one[in which State or] Congressional 2 3 Election District in which to register to vote for 4 National Elections[, but he or she shall register to 5 vote in only one State and Congressional Election District]." 6 Section 4. Section 404 of title 9 of the code of the Federated 7 States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: 9 "Section 404. Registration procedures. (1) A person desiring to register to vote in National 10 11 Elections shall complete such applications and 12 affidavits, take such oaths, and present such personal 13 documentation and witnesses, as required by the rules 14 and regulations promulgated by the National 15 ElectionDirector pursuant to this title. 16 (2) Regardless of the place of registration, 17 allcompleted applications and affidavits of registration shallbe transmitted to the national election 18 commissioner of the relevant state for final approval 19 20 and entry onto the National Voter Register. Voters 21 physically present outside of the Federated States of 22 Micronesia may submit their applications and affidavits 23 to the nearest FSM embassy or consulate. For this 24 purpose, an official in the FSM embassy or consulate may 25 be designated by the national election commissioners to

receive completed applications and affidavits of
registration, to maintain complete record in relation
thereto, and to immediately transmit them to the
appropriate national election commissioners for
processing.

- (3) Every completed application or affidavit ofregistration <u>filed with or transmitted to the national election commissioners</u> shall be <u>properly recorded</u>, maintained and preserved at the National Election Office of the State of registration until such time as the Registered Voter who completed the application or affidavit is deceased or is otherwise no longer eligible to vote.
- (4) All completed applications and affidavits of registration <u>must be processed expeditiouslywithin a</u>

  <u>period not to exceed ten (10) days after the filing of the application[shall be open to public inspection during regular business hours]. Processing means review and verification of the application, and the issuance of Voter Identification Card, or denial of the application, as the case may be.</u>
- (5) The [National Election Director may] national election commissioners shall issue Voter Identification Cards to their respective [all] Registered Voters at or after the time of registration. All Voter Identification

1	Cards shall be issued free of charge, provided that,
2	[there shall be] a charge may [in an amount to] be set
3	out in the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to
4	this title for issuing a Registered Voter with a
5	replacement Voter Identification Card. Upon issuing a
6	Voter Identification Card to a Registered Voter, the
7	National Election Director, or his or her designee,
8	shall make a notation next to that Registered Voter's
9	entry on the National Voter Register. A
LO	Registered Voter who has been issued a Voter
L1	Identification Card must present that card before being
L2	issued a ballot at his or her Polling Place. The national
L3	election commissionersshall be responsible in
L 4	maintaining complete records of application for
L 5	registration and timely distribution of Voter
L 6	Identification Card to the respective Registered Voters.
L7	For those applications filed at the FSM embassy or
L 8	consulate pursuant to subsection (2) of this section,
L 9	Voter Identification Cards shall be sent directly to the
20	mailing addresses indicated in the applications for
21	registration."
22	Section 5. This act shall become law upon approval by the
23	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon
24	itsbecoming law without such approval.
