A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend section 203 of title 2 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by P.L. Nos. 10-55, 15-09, and 15-74; and to further amend section 207 of title 2 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by P.L. Nos. 10-55, 11-40, 13-77, and 15-23; and to amend section 101 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, for the purpose of designating the administrative head of each department "Minister", and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 203 of Title 2 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia as amended by Public Laws Nos. 10-55, 15-09, and 15-74, is hereby further amended to read as follows: 5 "Section 203. Departments. 6 (1) There shall be the following departments which shall be responsible for major programs or 8 administrative support areas in the Government of the 9 Federated States of Micronesia: 10 (a) Department of Resources and Development; 11 (b) Department of Finance and Administration; 12 (c) Department of Foreign Affairs; 13 (d) Department of Health and Social Affairs; 14 (e) Department of Justice; 15 (f) Department of Transportation, Communication and Infrastructure, which shall contain among other 16

units, a Project Management Unit for the Compact

1	Infrastructure Grants; and
2	(g) Department of Education.
3	(2) The administrative head of each department shall
4	be designated as a [Secretary] <u>Minister</u> .
5	(3) The administrative head of each office shall be
6	designated as a "Director".
7	(4) Succession.
8	(a) Any reference to a previously existing
9	department, office or division thereof shall apply to
10	the appropriate successor entity.
11	(b) Any reference to any office or employee of an
12	entity referred to in subsection (4)(a) of this section
13	shall be construed as applying to the person holding the
14	same or most similar position in the appropriate
15	successor entity."
16	Section 2. Section 207 of Title 2 of the Code of the
17	Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos.
18	10-55, 11-40, 13-77, and 15-23, is hereby further amended to read
19	as follows:
20	"Section 207. Appointing Authority.
21	(1) The President shall nominate and, with the
22	advice and consent of the Congress, as provided in
23	article X, section 2(d), of the Constitution, shall
24	appoint the [secretaries] ministers of departments and
25	their deputies, if any, and the head of the office of
2.6	the Public Defender, including the [secretaries]

ministers, and heads of departments and offices
established by subsequent law; and including the
chairman and the members of the Board of Advisors for
the Investment Development Fund to be appointed by the
President; and including the Federated States of
Micronesia members of the Board of Regents of the
College of Micronesia; and including the Federated
States of Micronesia's consuls general[s] and the
deputy chiefs of mission of the various embassies and
diplomatic missions;

- (2) The President or his or her designee may appoint officers and employees not included in subsection (1) of this section, without the advice and consent of the Congress; provided that such appointments are not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter or other laws of the Federated States of Micronesia.
- (3) Any nomination submitted to Congress which is not acted upon within two (2) consecutive sessions of Congress, not including the session in which Congress first receives the nomination, or ninety (90) days, whichever occurs later in time, shall be deemed rejected. The President shall not resubmit the nomination of any person to the Congress for its action if the same Congress shall have previously rejected such nomination, unless the Congress shall by resolution authorize such resubmission.

1 (4) With the exception of the Chief Justice and 2 Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, the Public 3 Auditor, ambassadors, members of boards, commissions, 4 and other entities with fixed terms, a public official 5 whose appointment is subject to the advice and consent 6 of the Congress shall submit his or her resignation no 7 later than (90) ninety days after the President of the 8 Federated States of Micronesia takes the oath of 9 office, or at the time a new nominee for such position 10 is confirmed by the Congress, whichever is earlier. The President may renominate the same public official 11 12 for the same position subject to the advice and consent of the Congress. 13

Section 3. Section 101 of title 20 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 101. <u>Definitions</u>. As used in this title, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (1) 'Aeronautics' means the science and art of flight.
- (2) 'Air carrier' means any citizen of the Federated States of Micronesia who undertakes, whether directly or indirectly or by a lease or any other arrangement, to engage in air transportation: PROVIDED, that the Secretary may by order relieve air carriers who are not directly engaged in the operation of aircraft in air

transportation from the provisions of this title to the extent and for such periods as may be in the public interest.

- (3) 'Air commerce' means domestic or international air commerce or the transportation of mail by aircraft or any operation or navigation of aircraft within the limits of any National airway or any operation or navigation of aircraft that directly affects, or that may endanger safety in, domestic or international air commerce.
- (4) 'Air navigation facility' means any facility used in, available for use in, or designed for use in, aid of air navigation, including landing areas, lights, any apparatus or equipment for disseminating weather information, for signaling, for radio-directional finding, or for radio or other electrical communication, and any other structure or mechanism having a similar purpose for guiding or controlling flight in the air or the landing and take-off of aircraft.
- (5) 'Air transportation' means domestic or international air transportation or the transportation of mail by aircraft.
- (6) 'Aircraft engine' means an engine used, or intended to be used, for propulsion of aircraft and includes all parts and accessories thereof other than propellers.

1 (7) 'Aircraft' means any contrivance now known or
2 hereafter invented, used, or designed for navigation of
3 or flight in the air.

- (8) 'Airman' means any individual who engages, as the person in command or as pilot, mechanic, or member of the crew, in the navigation of aircraft while under way; and (except to the extent the Secretary may otherwise provide with respect to individuals employed outside the Federated States of Micronesia) any individual who is directly in charge of the inspection, maintenance, overhauling, or repair of aircraft, aircraft engines, propellers, or appliances; and any individual who serves in the capacity of aircraft dispatcher or air-traffic control-tower operator.
- (9) 'Airport' means a landing area used regularly by aircraft for receiving or discharging passengers or cargo.
- (10) 'Airport operator' means any person, state or state port authority engaged in the operation of an airport as defined herein.
- (11) 'Appliances' means instruments, equipment, apparatus, parts, or accessories, of whatever description, that are used, or are capable of being or intended to be used, in the navigation, operation, or control of aircraft in flight (including parachutes and including communication equipment and any other

mechanism or mechanisms installed in or attached to aircraft during flight), and that are not a part or parts of aircraft, aircraft engines, or propellers.

- (12) 'Attorney General' means the Attorney General of the Federated States of Micronesia.
- (13) 'Charter air carrier' means an air carrier holding a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing it to engage in charter air transportation.
- (14) 'Charter air transportation' means charter trips, including inclusive tour charter trips, in air transportation, rendered pursuant to authority conferred under this title under regulations prescribed by the Secretary.
- (15) 'Citizen of the Federated States of Micronesia' means (a) an individual who is a citizen of the Federated States of Micronesia or of one of its possessions, or (b) a partnership, corporation, or association considered to be a citizen under the laws of the Federated States of Micronesia.
- (16) 'Civil aircraft of the Federated States of Micronesia' means any aircraft registered as provided in this title.
- (17) 'Civil aircraft' means any aircraft other than a public aircraft.
 - (18) 'Civil Aviation Division' means the Civil

Aviation Division of the Department of Transportation
and Communications.

- (19) 'Conditional sale' means (a) any contract for the sale of an aircraft, aircraft engine, propeller, appliance, or spare part under which possession is delivered to the buyer and the property is to vest in the buyer at a subsequent time, upon the payment of part or all of the price, or upon the performance of any other condition or the happening of any contingency; or (b) any contract for the bailment or leasing of an aircraft, aircraft engine, propeller, appliance, or spare part, by which the bailee or lessee contracts to pay as compensation a sum substantially equivalent to the value thereof, and by which it is agreed that the bailee or lessee is bound to become, or has the option of becoming, the owner thereof upon full compliance with the terms of the contract. The buyer, bailee, or lessee shall be deemed to be the person by whom any such contract is made or given.
- (20) 'Conveyance' means a bill of sale, contract of conditional sale, mortgage, assignment of mortgage, or other instrument affecting title to, or interest in, property.
- (21) 'Department' means the Department of
 Transportation and Communications of the Federated
 States of Micronesia.

1	(22) 'Domestic air commerce', and 'international air
2	commerce', respectively, mean the carriage by aircraft
3	of persons or property for compensation or hire, or the
4	carriage of mail by aircraft, or the operation or
5	navigation of aircraft in the conduct or furtherance of
6	a business or vocation, in commerce between,
7	respectively:
8	(a) a place in the Federated States of

- (a) a place in the Federated States of Micronesia and any other place in the Federated States of Micronesia; and
- (b) a place in the Federated States of Micronesia and any place outside thereof.
- (23) 'Domestic air transportation', and 'international air transportation', respectively, mean the carriage by aircraft of persons or property as a common carrier for compensation or hire or the carriage of mail by aircraft, in commerce between, respectively:
- (a) a place in the Federated States of Micronesia and any other place in the Federated States of Micronesia; and
- (b) a place in the Federated States of Micronesia and any place outside thereof.
- (24) 'The Federated States of Micronesia' means the states of the Federated States of Micronesia, including the territorial waters and the overlying airspace thereof.

(25) 'Foreign air carrier' means any person, not a

citizen of the Federated States of Micronesia, who

undertakes, whether directly or indirectly or by lease

or any other arrangement, to engage in international air

transportation.

- (26) 'Landing area' means any location, either on land or water, including airports and intermediate landing fields, that is used, or intended to be used, for the landing and take-off of aircraft, whether or not facilities are provided for the shelter, servicing, or repair of aircraft, or for receiving or discharging passengers or cargo.
 - (27) 'Mail' means FSM mail and foreign-transit mail.
- (28) 'National airway' means a portion of the navigable airspace of the Federated States of Micronesia designated by the Secretary as a National airway.
- (29) 'Navigable airspace' means airspace above the minimum altitudes of flight prescribed by regulations issued under this Title, and shall include airspace needed to insure safety in take off and landing of aircraft.
- (30) 'Navigation of aircraft' or 'navigate aircraft' includes the piloting of aircraft.
- (31) 'Operation of aircraft' or 'operate aircraft' means the use of aircraft, for the purpose of air navigation and includes the navigation of aircraft. Any

person who causes or authorizes the operation of
aircraft, whether with or without the right of legal
control (in the capacity of owner, lessee, or otherwise)
of the aircraft, shall be deemed to be engaged in the
operation of aircraft within the meaning of this title.

- (32) 'Person' means any individual, firm,
 partnership, corporation, company, association,
 joint-stock association, or body politic; and includes
 any trustee, receiver, assignee, or other similar
 representative thereof.
- (33) 'Propeller' includes all parts and accessories thereof.
- (34) 'Public aircraft' means any aircraft used exclusively in the service of any government or of any political subdivision thereof, including the government of any province, territory, or possession of the Federated States of Micronesia, but not including any government-owned aircraft engaged in carrying persons or property for commercial purposes.
- (35) 'Secretary' means the [Secretary] Minister of Department of Transportation and Communications.
- (36) 'Spare parts' means parts and accessories of aircraft (other than aircraft engines and propellers), of aircraft engines (other than propellers), of propellers and of appliances, maintained for installation or use in an aircraft, aircraft engine,

propeller, or appliance, but that at the time are not 1 installed therein or attached thereto. 2 3 (37) 'Special aircraft jurisdiction of the Federated 4 States of Micronesia' includes: 5 (a) civil aircraft of the Federated States of 6 Micronesia; 7 (b) any other aircraft within the Federated States of Micronesia; 9 (c) any other aircraft outside the Federated States of Micronesia: 10 11 (i) that has its next scheduled 12 destination or last point of departure in the Federated States of Micronesia, if that aircraft next actually 13 14 lands in the Federated States of Micronesia; 15 (ii) having 'an offense', as defined in the Convention for the Suppression of Unlawful Seizure of 16 17 Aircraft, committed aboard, if that aircraft lands in the Federated States of Micronesia with the alleged 18 19 offender still aboard; or 20 (iii) regarding which an offense as defined in subsection (d) or (e) of article I, section I of the 21 22 Convention for the Suppression of Unlawful Acts against 23 the Safety of Civil Aviation (Montreal, September 23, 24 1971) is committed if the aircraft lands in the 25 Federated States of Micronesia with an alleged offender 26 still on board; and

(d) other aircraft leased without crew to a 1 2 lessee who has his principal place of business in the 3 Federated States of Micronesia, or if none, who has his 4 permanent residence in the Federated States of 5 Micronesia; while that aircraft is in flight, which is from the moment when all external doors are closed 6 7 following embarkation until the moment when one such 8 door is opened for disembarkation or in the case of a 9 forced landing, until the competent authorities take 10 over the responsibility for the aircraft and for the 11 persons and property aboard.

- (38) 'Supreme Court' means the Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia.
- (39) 'Ticket agent' means any person, not an air carrier or a foreign air carrier and not a bona fide employee of an air carrier or foreign air carrier, who, as principal or agent, sells or offers for sale any air transportation, or negotiates for, or holds himself out by solicitation, advertisement, or otherwise as one who sells, provides, furnishes, contracts or arranges for, such transportation."
- Section 4. This act shall become law upon approval by the President of the Federated Sates of Micronesia or upon its becoming law without such approval.
