A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget of \$6,610,930 from the General Fund of the Federated States for fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by Public Law No. 18-102, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
