Presidential Statement on the signing of Congressional Act No. 18-18, entitled: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE \$45,166,002 FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2014, TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE OPERATIONS OF ALL BRANCHES OF THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA, ITS AGENCIES, VARIOUS PROGRAMS, GRANTS, SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS AND CAPITAL AND HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

I take this opportunity to thank the Eighteenth Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia for passing the Fiscal Year 2014 Budget. I am quite pleased that Congress accepted the domestic revenue projection of the Executive Branch as the basis of the budget. The domestic local revenue projection for the Fiscal Year 2014 Budget is \$54.3 million. Of this amount, \$41,653,844 is appropriated in this Act leaving \$12,667,166 unappropriated revenue projection.

A number of important and essential items were not approved during this session. We ask Congress to reconsider these essential components of the FY 2014 budget at the next opportunity.

I decided to item veto the \$5,000,000 Trust Fund because of the added condition of the funding as explained in the Standing Committee Report No. 18-37, W&M, September 24, 2013, which is to distribute this fund equally among the five governments. I proposed the passage of Congressional Bill No. 18-10 for the establishment of a unified trust fund for the Federated States of Micronesia in order to prepare the nation in the event of catastrophic disasters. That bill remains pending in Congress. The FSM Trust Fund envisioned in the bill will introduce clarity and purpose of the existing trust fund, which will be transitioned into the new FSM Trust Fund. Furthermore, the new trust fund is necessary in order to prepare the nation for available funding from the United Nations and international partners for climate change mitigation and adaptation programs. The appropriation for trust fund in this Congressional Act not only contradicts Congressional Bill No. 18-10, it is incompatible with potential climate change funding mentioned above that usually comes with strings attached. Requiring donors to observe sub-account arrangements is counter-productive. I therefore urge Congress to immediately consider the passage of Congressional Bill No. 18-10 and thereafter appropriate deposits into the Trust Fund.

In addition, the Set Aside fund is not in the Budget notwithstanding its indispensable link to the funding of financially viable and sustainable investment projects and the challenges of 2023. I will continue to engage Congress on this important program because the nation needs our focused attention in order to prepare for the expiration of the financial provisions in the Amended Compact. I will renew request and invite all the Members of Congress to a dialogue and consultation on the Set Aside Fund soon.

AN ACT

To appropriate \$45,166,002 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2014, to provide funding for the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Title. The title of this act is as follows: To
2 appropriate the sum of \$45,166,002 from the General Fund of the
3 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
4 September 30, 2014, for the purpose of funding the operations of
5 all branches of the National Government of the Federated States
6 of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies
7 and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development.
8 Of the total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$2,400,000
9 shall be deemed to come from funds available under the Amended

12 sector; \$-0- shall be deemed to come from funds available under
13 the Amended Compact from the infrastructure sector; \$-0- shall be
14 deemed to come from funds available under the Amended Compact

2 the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Federated States of
3 Micronesia;

4 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds shall be
5 the Public Auditor of the Federated States of Micronesia;

6 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these
7 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of
8 Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following subsections
9 of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

10 (i) Section 8(6)(g) - the allottee shall be the
11 President of the College of Micronesia - FSM; and

12 (ii) Section 8, (13)(a) through (d) - the
13 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the
14 respective State Supreme Court;

15 (iii) Section 8 (10)(a) through (d) - the
16 allottee of these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of
17 the Federated States of Micronesia; and

18 (iv) Section 9(1)(a) through (c) - the allottee
19 of these funds shall be the President of the College of
20 Micronesia-FSM.

21 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
22 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of
23 September 30, 2014; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds
24 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not lapse.

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1 Section 14. This act shall become law upon approval by the
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
3 becoming law without such approval.
