AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 18-35, as amended by Public Law No. 18-49, by amending sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 thereof, to change the use and allottee of funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs for the people of Yap, Kosrae, Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

14	Public Law No. 18-49, is hereby further amended to read as
15	follows:
16	"Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
17	date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
18	allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
19	accordance with applicable laws, including, but not
20	limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The
21	allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these
22	funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used
23	solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that
24	no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum
25	appropriated whe allottee of the funde appropriated

25appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated26under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap

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1	State provided that the allottee of funds appropriated
2	under section 2(e) shall be the President of COM-FSM.
3	The allottee of funds appropriated under sections 3 and
4	4 of this act shall be the President of the Federated
5	States of Micronesia or his designee, EXCEPT THAT the
