## A RESOLUTION

Requesting the President, in conjunction with the Department of Foreign Affairs, to actively seek funding from international donors for the construction of a bridge in the State of Chuuk, Mortlocks, between the islands of Satowan and Ta.

WHEREAS, more than 3,000 citizens live on our atoll islands 1 of Satowan and Ta in the Mortlocks in the State of Chuuk; and 2 WHEREAS, the citizens of Satowan and Ta travel between their 3 4 two islands routinely in their daily lives; and WHEREAS, no bridge or land mass currently connects the 5 islands of Satowan and Ta, making travel between the two less 6 7 efficient and in many cases more dangerous than is the case of using ground transportation; and 8 WHEREAS, our Nation's government should promote full and 9 10 efficient transportation for our citizens in order that they may achieve all their business, development and cultural goals; and 11 12 WHEREAS, it would greatly benefit the citizens of the islands of Satowan and Ta to have a bridge connecting the two islands; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia requests that the President, in conjunction with the Department 16 17 of Foreign Affairs, to actively seek funding from international 18 donors for the construction of a bridge in the State of Chuuk Mortlocks, between the islands of Satowan and Ta; now, therefore, 19
