PUBLIC LAW NO. 18-102

AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget of \$36,387,961 from the General Fund of the Federated States for fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 8, 9, 10 and 13 of Public Law No. 18-89, to provide funding for operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 18-89 is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:
3 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
4 appropriate the sum of \$90,936,665 from the General Fund
5 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
6 year ending September 30, 2015, for the purpose of
7 funding the operations of all branches of the National
8 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
9 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
10 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
11 Development. The National Government's share of the
12 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero except
13 that the National Government will retain ten percent
14 (10%) of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is
15 reflected in the budget for the Department of Education.
16 The budget shall also include appropriations for COM-FSM
17 from sector grants as well as appropriations from

1 amended Compact carry-over funds.

2 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 18-89 is hereby
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 2. Operating expenses of the Executive Branch.

5 The sum of \$17,455,735, or so much thereof as may be
6 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund
7 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
8 year ending September 30, 2015, for the purpose of
9 funding the operations of the Executive Branch of the
10 National Government during the fiscal year 2015. The
11 sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as
12 follows:

12 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
13 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
14 accordance with applicable law, including, but not
15 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

16 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for
17 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
18 necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
19 this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
20 of the sums appropriated.

21 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
22 appropriated by this act are as follows:

23 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall
24 be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

25 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds shall

1 be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States
2 of Micronesia;

3 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds shall
4 be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
5 Federated States of Micronesia;

6 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds shall
7 be the Public Auditor of the Federated States of
8 Micronesia;

9 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these
10 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of
11 Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following
12 subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

13 (i) Section 8(4)(s) and (x) - the allottee
14 of these funds shall be the Governor of Yap State.

15 (ii) Section 8(4)(u) and (y) - the allottee
16 of these funds shall be the Governor of Chuuk State.

17 (iii) Section 8(4)(r) and (v) - the allottee
18 of these funds shall be the Governor of Kosrae State.

19 (iv) Section 8(4)(t) and (w) - the allottee of
20 these funds shall be the Governor of Pohnpei State.

21 (v) Section 8(6)(g) - the allottee shall be
22 the President of the College of Micronesia - FSM; and

23 (vi) Section 8(13)(a) through (d) - the
24 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of
25 the respective State Supreme Court;

1 (vii) Section 8(10)(a) through (i) - the
2 allottee of these funds shall be the Speaker of the
3 Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia; and

4 (viii) Section 8(13)(o) - the allottee of these
5 funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of
6 the Federated States of Micronesia;

7 (ix) Section 9(1)(a) through (c), the
8 allottee of these funds shall be the President of the
9 College of Micronesia-FSM.

10 (x) Section 9(3)(a), the allottee of the
11 Chamber of Commerce from the President to the President
12 of the FSM Association of Chamber of Commerce.

13 (xi) Section 9(4)(g), the allottee of these
14 funds shall be the Governor of Chuuk State.

15 (xii) Section 9(4)(i), the allottee of these
16 funds shall be the Governor of Yap State.

17 (xiii) Section 9(14)(f) the allottee of these
18 funds shall be the Governor of Kosrae State.

19 (xiv) Section 9(14)(g) the allottee of these
20 funds shall be the Governor of Pohnpei State.

21 (xv) Section 9(14)(h) - the allottee of these
22 funds shall be the Governor of Yap State.

23 (xvi) Section 9(14)(i) the allottee of these
24 funds shall be the Governor of Chuuk State.

25 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to

1 obliterate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as
2 of September 30, 2015; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds
3 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not
4 lapse."

5 Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the
6 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
7 becoming law without such approval.
