## NINETEENTH CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of \$1,884,482 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, and 18-116, to change the conditions of certain funds therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended
 by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, and 18-116, is hereby
 further amended to read as follows:

The purpose of this act is to 5 appropriate the sum of [<del>\$96,498,776</del>] \$98,383,258 from 6 the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia 7 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, for the purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the 8 9 National Government of the Federated States of 10 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, 11 subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human 12 Resources Development. The National Government's share 13 of the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero except that the National Government will retain ten 14 15 percent (10%) of the Supplemental Education Grant funds 16 as is reflected in the budget for the Department of 17 Education. The budget shall also include appropriations for COM-FSM from sector grants as well as appropriations 18
