A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of \$578,396 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9, and 13 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02 to change the conditions of certain funds therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by
 Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02, is hereby

The budget shall also include appropriations for COM-FSM from 16 17 sector grants as well as appropriations from amended Compact carry-over funds." 18
