A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 19-32, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 19-45, 19-61, 19-83 and 19-95 by amending section 9 thereof, to change the use of funds previously appropriated therein, for the purpose of funding for the Chuuk State Priority Infrastructure Projects, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 9 of Public Law No. 19-32, as amended by
- 2 Public Laws Nos. 19-45, 19-61, 19-83 and 19-95, is hereby further
- 3 amended, to read as follows:

- 5 The sum of \$38,984,608, or so much thereof as may be

- 7 Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the
- 8 fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, for the

- 10 and projects and human resources development. Of the
- total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$689,598
- shall be deemed to come from funds available under
- 13 the Amended Compact from the Supplemental Education
- 14 Grant. The sum appropriated by this section shall be
- 15 apportioned as follows:
