Dear Speaker Simina:

I am pleased to transmit the following congressional act, which I signed to become Public Law No. 19-61:

Congressional Act No. 19-63, entitled: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE A SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,906,232 FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2016, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 4, 8, 9 AND 12 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 19-32, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAW NO. 19-45, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

I signed this act into law despite the fact that some items in the supplemental budget are excessive and not clearly justified. I feel obligated to convey to Congress in clear terms that it is unsustainable to continue this practice of excessive and unjustified appropriations.

The conduct of foreign affairs is constitutionally assigned to the executive branch. Setting aside large travel funds for Congressional delegation for international meetings that are not legislative in nature may lead to a breach of the separation of powers stipulated in the constitution. The separation of powers between our branches of government must be respected. The executive branch by constitution leads in the process of international diplomacy.

Based on the foregoing, I again express serious concern on the propriety of dedicating large sums of public funds for Congress' travels to the World Bank/IMF annual meeting and to the Crans Montana Forum in Morocco. The FSM representatives in the board of governors attend these annual meetings, and participation by Congress is by invitation. Moreover, participants from most of the countries attending the Crans Montana Forum are from the executive branches of their governments.

During this time of limited fiscal resources, it is difficult for me to endorse the spending of large sums of public funds for Congress' attendance at these meetings, such as the Wiltshire investment conference and meetings with constituents in the US.
