A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate \$71,530 of Supplemental Education Grant (SEG) by amending sections 1 and 9 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by Public Law No. 20-54, to make a technical correction, and for other purposes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA: 1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by 2 Public Law No. 20-54, is hereby further amended to read as 3 follows: "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to 4 appropriate the sum of \$[77,236,100] 77,307,630 from the 5 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for 6 7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, for the purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the 8 National Government of the Federated States of 9 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, 10 subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human 11 12 Resources Development. The National Government's share of the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; 13 EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain 10 14 percent of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is 15 16 reflected in the budget for the Department of Education. The sum appropriated herein shall be apportioned as 17 follows: 18

19 Section 2. Section 9 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by20 Public Law No. 20-54, is hereby further amended to read as

13	from funds available under the Amended Compact from
14	Compact Sector Grants. The sum appropriated by this
