A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-54 and 20-64, in order to appropriate \$4,451,203 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to amend certain section sub-titles, to change the allottee for a particular line item, and for other purposes.
