A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate \$2,701,521 of supplemental funds from the from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, by amending sections 1, 2, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended Public Laws Nos. 20-54 and 20-64, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
