## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 17-36, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 17-48, 17-78, 17-87, 18-36, 18-60, 18-65, 18-84, 19-22 and 19-109, by amending sections 5 and 6 therein, to change the use and lapse date of certain funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs in the state of Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 5 of Public Law No. 17-36, as amended

18	"Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and	
19	lapse date. All funds appropriated by this act shall	
20	be allotted, managed, administered and accounted for	
21	in accordance with applicable laws, including, but n	ot
22	limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The	
23	allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that thes	e
24	funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are	
25	used solely for the purpose specified in this act, a	ind

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1 that no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum 2 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated under Section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of 3 Yap State. The allottee of funds appropriated under 4 5 sections 3 and 4 of this act shall be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee; 6 7 EXCEPT THAT, the allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 4(1)(b), 4(3)(a) and (b) of section 4 of 8 9 this act shall be the Pohnpei Transportation Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under 10 subsection 4(2)(j) of section 4 shall be the Chief 11 Magistrate of Sokehs Municipal Government. 12 The 13 allottee of funds appropriated under subsections 5(1), 5(3) and 5(6) of section 5 of this act shall be the 14 15 Governor of Chuuk State or his designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(2) of section 16 5 of this act shall be the Mortlock Islands 17 Development Authority; the allottee of funds 18 appropriated under subsection 5(4) of section 5 of 19 20 this act shall be the Southern Namoneas Development 21 Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(5) of section 5 of this act shall be the 2.2 Faichuk Development Authority. The allottee of funds 23 24 appropriated under subsection 5(6)(f) shall be the 25 President of COM-FSM. The authority of the allottee

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1	to obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse
2	on September 30, [ <del>2018</del> ] <u>2019</u> ."

4	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
5	becoming law without such approval.
