PUBLIC LAW NO. 20-54

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 20-42 by appropriating \$9,333,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to provide funding for the set-up and operations costs of a consulate on the West Coast of the United States, for the FSM Trust Fund, and for the Telecommunications cable project; to make a technical correction, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-42 as hereby amended to read 2 as follows:

3 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the sum of \$77,236,100 from the General Fund 4 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal 5 year ending September 30, 2018, for the purpose of 6 7 funding the operations of all branches of the National 8 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its 9 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources 10 The National Government's share of the 11 Development. Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT 12 13 THAT; the National Government will retain 10 percent of 14 the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in the budget for the Department of Education. 15 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows: 16 Section 2. 17 Section 8 of Public Law No. 20-42 is hereby
