A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116 and 21-147, to appropriate \$3,056,347 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the executive branch of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia; to provide additional funding for Grants, Subsidies and Contributions and for Capital and Human Resources Development; to allow payment of prior years obligations under certain appropriated funds for Subsidies and Contributions; to extend the lapse date of the certain funding under Subsidies and Contributions, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
