
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116 and 21-147, to appropriate \$3,056,347 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the executive branch of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia; to provide additional funding for Grants, Subsidies and Contributions and for Capital and Human Resources Development; to allow payment of prior years obligations under certain appropriated funds for Subsidies and Contributions; to extend the lapse date of the certain funding under Subsidies and Contributions, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by
2 Public Law Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116 and 21-147, is hereby
3 further amended to read as follows:

11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
12 Development. The National Government's share of the
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact

1 Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
 2 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in
 3 the budget for the Department of Education. The sum

15 Section 5. Section 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by
16 Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116, and 21-147 is hereby
17 further amended to read as follows:

18 "Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and
19 Lapse Dates.

20 (1) General provisions.

21 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
22 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
23 accordance with applicable law, including, but not
24 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

25 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for

1 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
2 necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
3 this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
4 of the sums appropriated.

5 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
6 appropriated by this act are as follows:

7 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall
8 be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

9 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds shall
10 be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States
11 of Micronesia;

12 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds shall
13 be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
14 Federated States of Micronesia;

15 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
16 Public Auditor of the Federated States of Micronesia;

17 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these
18 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of
19 Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following
20 subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

21 (i) Sections 8(1)(f) and 8(13)(q) - the
22 allottee of these funds shall be the Chair of the Joint
23 Committee on Compact Review and Planning;

24 (ii) Section 8(8)(a) - the allottee of these
25 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

1 (iii) Section 8(8)(b) – the allottee of these
2 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

3 (iv) Section 8(8)(c) – the allottee of these
4 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

5 (v) Section 8(8)(d) – the allottee of these
6 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

7 (vi) Section 8(11) – the allottee of these
8 funds shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated
9 States of Micronesia;

10 (vii) Section 8(12) – the allottee of these
11 funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
12 Federated States of Micronesia;

13 (viii) Section 8(13)(a) – the allottee of these
14 funds shall be the President of the College of
15 Micronesia-FSM;

16 (ix) Section 8(13)(d) through (g) – the
17 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of
18 the respective State Supreme Court;

19 (x) Section 8(13)(h) – the allottee of these
20 funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of
21 the Federated States of Micronesia;

22 (xi) Section 9(1) – the allottee of these
23 funds shall be the President of the College of
24 Micronesia-FSM;

25 (xii) Section 9(3)(b) – the allottee of these

1 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

2 (xiii) Section 9(3)(c) – the allottee of
3 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of
4 Pohnpei;

5 (xiv) Section 9(3)(d) – the allottee of
6 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

7 (xv) Section 9(3)(e) – the allottee of
8 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

9 (xvi) Section 9(12)(b) – the allottee of
10 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
11 Federated States of Micronesia;

12 (xvii) Section 9(12)(f)– the allottee of
13 these funds shall be the Governor of the State of Chuuk;

14 (xviii) Section 8(13)(t) – the allottee of
15 these funds shall be the National Olympic Committee;

16 (xix) Section 8(13)(u) – the allottee of
17 these funds shall be the Principal of Saint Cecilia
18 Catholic School;

19 (xx) Section 9(12)(d) – the allottee of
20 these funds shall be the President of the Constitutional
21 Convention.

22 (xxi) Section 9(12)(g) – the allottee of
23 these funds shall be the Mayor of Pingelap.

24 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
25 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as

1 of September 30, 2020; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that funds
2 under section 8(8)(j) for INTERPOL shall not lapse until
3 March 30, 2021, and that the funds appropriated under
4 section 9 of this act shall not lapse.

5 Section 6. This act shall become law upon approval by the
6 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
7 becoming law without such approval.
