
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116, 21-147, and 21-171, to appropriate \$240,000 of additional supplemental funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, to provide additional funding for Grants, Subsidies and Contributions and for Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by
2 Public Law Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116, 21-147, and 21-171,
3 is hereby further amended to read as follows:

4 "Purpose. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the
5 sum of \$[~~73,475,575~~] 73,715,575, from the General Fund
6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
7 year ending September 30, 2020, for the purpose of
8 funding the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
12 Development. The National Government's share of the
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact
15 Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
16 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in
17 the budget for the Department of Education. The sum

1 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

2 Section 2. Section 8 of Public Law No. 21-42 as amended by
 3 Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-147, and 21-171, is
 4 hereby further amended to read as follows:

5 "Section 8. Grants, Subsidies and Contributions. The
 6 sum of \$[~~18,140,838~~] 18,145,838, or so much thereof as
 7 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
 8 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for
 9 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, for the
 10 following grants, subsidies and contributions during
 11 fiscal year 2020. The sum appropriated by this section
