PUBLIC LAW NO. 21-238

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 8, 9, and 12 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-210 and 21-221 to appropriate \$2,871,547 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; the Legislative Branch; the Judicial Branch; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 21-210 and 21-221, is hereby further amended to
3 read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
5 appropriate the sum of \$75,125,569 from the General Fund
6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
7 year ending September 30, 2021, for the purpose of
8 funding the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
12 Development. The National Government's share of the
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact
15 Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
16 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in
17 the budget for the Department of Education. The sum

1 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

2 Section 2. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by
3 Public Law No. 21-221, is hereby further amended to read as

5 "Section 2. Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch.

 25 by Public Laws Nos. 21-210 and 21-221, is hereby further amended

10 (ii) Section 8(8)(a) - the allottee of these
11 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

12 (iii) Section 8(8)(b) - the allottee of these
13 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

14 (iv) Section 8(8)(c) - the allottee of these
15 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

16 (v) Section 8(8)(d) - the allottee of these
17 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

18 (vi) Section 8(11) - the allottee of these
19 funds shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated
20 States of Micronesia;

14 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Yap;

15 (xxiv) Section 9(3)(y) – the allottee of these
16 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

17 (xxv) Section 9(3)(z) – the allottee of these
18 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

19 (xxvi) Section 9(3)(aa) – the allottee of
20 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of
21 Kosrae; and

22 (xxvii) Section 9(3)(bb) – the allottee of
23 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

24 (xxviii) Section 9(11)(p) – the allottee of these
25 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Chuuk;

1 (xxix) Section 9(11)(q) – the allottee of these
2 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Yap;

3 (xxx) Section 9(11)(r) – the allottee of these
4 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Kosrae.”

5 Section 8. This act shall become law upon approval by the
6 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
7 becoming law without such approval.
