A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 7 and 8 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Law No. 22-60, to appropriate \$941,575 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide additional funding for the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, National Election; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

The National Government's share 13 of the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; 14 EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain the 15 Compact Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is 16 17 reflected in the budget for the Department of Education.
