A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 8 of Public Law No. 22-153, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-169 and 22-181, to reallocate the funds for the 45% salary increase previously appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, by Public Law No. 22-181, by reducing the funds appropriated in Section 8 and placing them in the operational budget of the National Government, in Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this bill is to reallocate the funds for the 45% salary increase previously appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, by Public Law No. 22-181, by reducing the funds appropriated in Section 8 and placing them in the operational budget of the national government, in Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.
