PUBLIC LAW NO. 22-01

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 12 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-210, 21-221 and 21-238, to deappropriate \$794,754 and repurpose funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; the Legislative Branch; the Judicial Branch; National Public Auditor; Agencies, Boards, Authorities, and Commissions; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; Capital and Human Resources Development, to change the allottee of certain funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
