### TWENTY-SECOND CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA

SIXTH SPECIAL SESSION, 2022 CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 22-265, C.D.1, C.D.2, C.D.3, C.D.4, C.D.5, C.D.6, C.D.7, C.D.8 P.C. NO. 22-380 PUBLIC LAW NO. 22-169

### AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 22-153, to appropriate \$8,993,147 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive and Legislative branches, National Public Auditor, and Agencies of the National Government; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resources Development; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 22-153 is hereby
