PUBLIC LAW NO. 22-203

AN ACT

To further amend section 9 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-116, 21-147, 21-171, 21-183 and 22-156, to change the use of funds previously appropriated therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA: 1 Section 1. Section 9 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by 2 Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-116, 21-147, 21-171, 21-183 and 3 22-156, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 9. Capital and Human Resources Development. 5 The sum of \$19,695,326, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal 7 year ending September 30, 2020, for the following 8 9 capital improvements, development programs, and projects and human resources development. Of the total amount of 10 funds appropriated herein, \$1,000,000 shall be deemed to 11 come from funds available under the amended Compact from 12 education sector; and \$1,246,022 shall be deemed to come 13 14 from funds available under Supplemental Education Grant. 15 The sum appropriated by this section shall be 16 apportioned as follows:
