## AN ACT

To appropriate \$69,632,359 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide funding for the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
- 2 appropriate the sum of \$69,632,359 from the General Fund of the
- 3 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
- 4 September 30, 2022, for the purpose of funding the operations of
- 5 all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of
- 6 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
- 7 contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development. The
- 8 National Government's share of the Amended Compact funds has been
- 9 reduced to zero; EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain
- 10 the Compact Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
- 11 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in the budget
- 12 for the Department of Education. The sum appropriated herein
- 13 shall be apportioned as follows:
